Cook's Corner

WESTERN SUPPER EGGS

One-third cup oil, 3/4 cup chopped onion, 1 teaspoon finely chopped garlic, 3 tablespoons flour, 4 teaspoons chili powder, 1 1/2 teaspoons salt, 1 1/2 cups cooked or canned tomatoes, 1/2 cup water, 2/3 cup chopped ripe olives, 1 cup grated Canadian cheese, 5 shredded wheat biscuits, 5 eggs, whole ripe olives for garnish.

Heat oil in large skillet; fry onion and garlic in hot oil until onion is wilted. Add flour, chili powder and salt. Cook, stirring continuously until well blended.

Add tomatoes, water and chopped olives. Heat to boiling and cook until thick. Stir in cheese. With sharp knife or scissors, cut away small portion of tops and centers in shredded wheat biscuits, leaving sides and bottoms whole. Place in baking pan. Break uncooked egg in center of each biscuit. Pour sauce carefully over all. Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees F.) about 15 to 20 minutes or until egg yolks are firm. Serve hot with garnish of whole ripe olives.

Serves 5.

Mrs. James McIntyre of West Royalty is 104, her mother topped this life span of life by one year. Samuel Clow of Meadowbank passed away a few years ago at 93, his mother reached the century mark, and his father and grandfather passed on in their late 90's.

Frank Howard of Cornwall, now 78, is one of a family of 14 children. Four died comparatively young, but the other ten all passed man's allotted span of life.

The sisters who belong to this longevity group were: Mrs. Archie Stetson of Port Saskatchewan, who died at the ripe age of 81 years, Mrs. Henry Weeks passed away at Springfield, P. E. 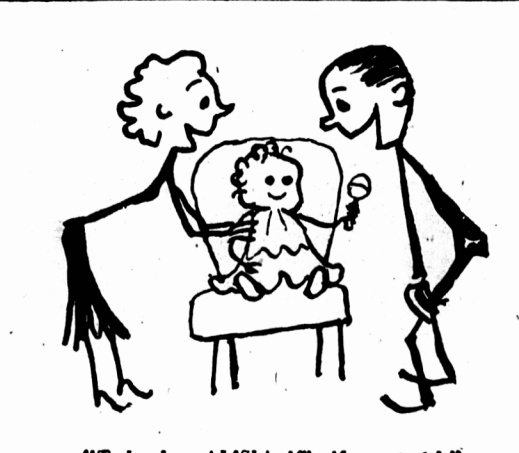
