

# U.S. Makes New Inroads In Canadian Wheat at Sales

 OTTAWA (CP)—United States surplus disposal programs during the last year have made sizeable inroads into Canada's wheat and flour sales to Caribbean countries, traditionally a stable Canadian outlet.

Through subsidies, revolving funds and other incentives, U.S. has managed to boost its exports to the area at the expense of Canadian sellers.

These are the policies which Finance Minister Fleming criticized sharply in a New York speech last week. Canada is far from so satisfied with assurances that the U.S. government will

limit its agricultural products surplus disposal program, he said.

Mr. Fleming expressed the hope that by co-operation and consultation with the U.S. he might find some better way of meeting our very real farm problems than by following any "beggar-my-neighbor" policies.

Among the hardest hit outlets for Canadian flour and wheat were the British eastern Caribbean islands.

**BIG CUT**

Trade Commissioner Roy W. Blake, based in Port of Spain, Trinidad, in a report published in the current issue of Foreign Trade, said publication of the de-

partment of trade and commerce which reviewed business conditions in the Caribbean, said during the first six months of this year, Trinidad reduced her purchases of Canadian flour to 20,300,000 pounds from 44,008,000 pounds in the corresponding period last year.

In the same period U.S. sales increased to 20,100,000 pounds from 6,500,000 the previous year. Similar situations were reported in the Barbados and British Guiana.

The market for Canadian wheat was virtually closed in Guatemala as the result of a move by the Guatemalan government to provide special financing facilities for local millers only in the revolving fund set up by the American international co-operation administration.

Assistant trade commissioner R. M. Dawson, who reported on purchases of Canadian wheat, said that he had dropped by \$250,000 last year and will probably drop as much or more during 1957.

The trade commissioner's report from 14 countries stressed generally that Canadian exporters can obtain a share of the business in the Caribbean area only by offering goods that are comparable in quality and price with those from other countries.

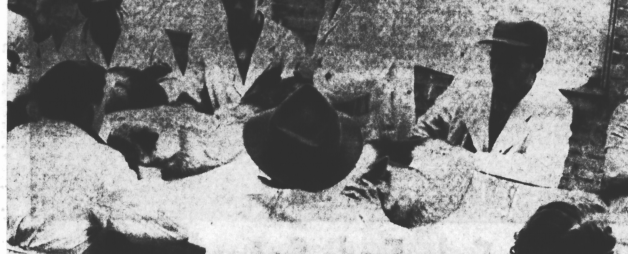
# In Hospital Since July

# Sailor's Case Unusual One At Summerside

The arrest of a sailor from the Liberian freighter "Aldwall" presently unloading a cargo of fertilizer at the Summerside Marine Wharf, poses a rather unusual problem for Summerside Police.

The sailor, a Negro from British Honduras, was taken into custody after assault charges were laid by the Greek captain of the ship, who alleges that the accused struck him during an exchange of words on board ship. While admitting he struck the Captain, the accused pleaded "not guilty".

Police Court yesterday morning, where he maintained that the Captain in ordering him to work had made in sultry references to his Negro ancestry, and that the Captain had struck him first.

After evidence from the two men involved in the incident was heard by Magistrate E.H. Strong, the case was adjourned until Friday morning.

Meanwhile the accused is under detention at Prince County Jail, and his immediate future seems rather uncertain because the Captain has indicated he will deny the sailor permission to return to the ship because he has no Canadian passport the accused is not at liberty to travel in this country, and consequently the matter is of interest to Canadian Customs and Immigration officials.

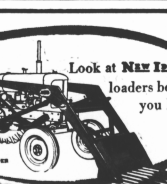
