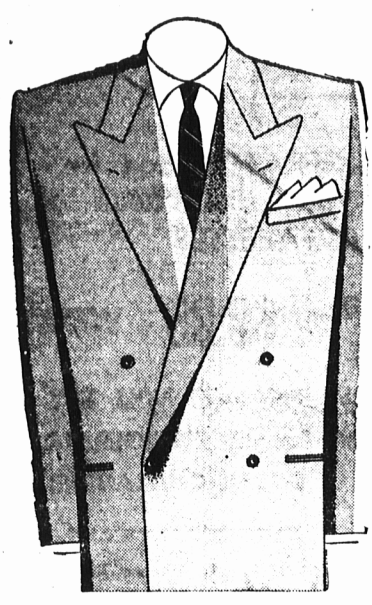

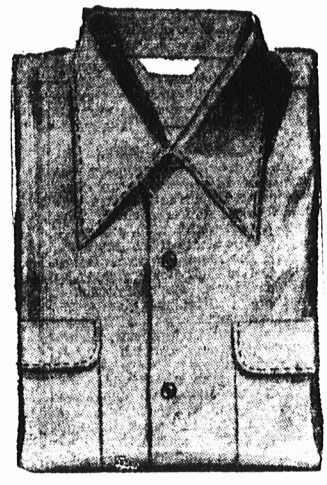

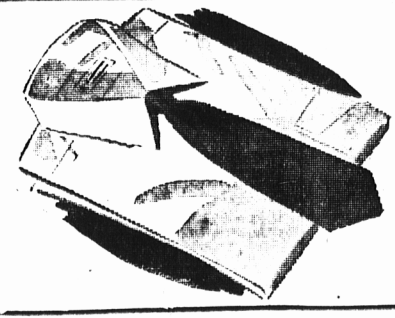

The first of the eight with Irving MacKinnon on third base and nobody out. Using his fast ball the strong righthander fanned the next three batters to save the game for his mates.

The winning pitcher was Johnny "Control" Squarebriggs. The son of a well known hockey player by the same name, he allowed thirteen hits during the seven innings he worked but did not give up an earned run. Although hit hard he maintained magnificent control and did not issue a walk. He struck out four.

The Abbies built up a fat 4-1 lead for Squarebriggs in the first two innings. They scored one run

in the first inning as the result of four walks. In the second inning they scored three more, two of them as the result of a pick-off play between Arnold MacCallum and Lorne Hennessey which failed to work.

M.C.A. got back into the ball game in the sixth inning by scoring three runs. The Airways players got three singles in this frame the big one being Art Hughes' base knock which drove two men across the plate.

The score stood 5-4 for the Abbies as the eighth inning opened. The lead-off batter, rangy Irving MacKinnon walloped a Squarebriggs pitch into deep centrefield for a triple. The blow was MacKinnon's third safety in three trips.

But the long fellow who wears No. 13 on his back was destined to stay on third. Abbies coach Mac-

Neill gave the signal to MacLean and the no-hit author responded magnificently.

The first victim was Art Hughes and Art went down after taking a half-hearted third swing. Next it was Freddy Keillor who twice tried to bunt. And lastly it was the great lefthander "Lefty" MacAleer, who has fired many a-third strike past a batter. MacKinnon tried his best to get home, even moved third base a few feet closer to home plate, but he died on old number three.

The Winning Run

The winning run for the Abbies was scored in the fourth inning by pitcher Squarebriggs. The young hurler led off the inning with a single and was tripped home by Brian Lewis who smashed a long drive into left field for his first

triple of the season.

Kenny Wilson started on the mound for M.C.A. in the first inning he walked four and struck out three. In the three innings he worked he gave up four runs and one hit.

"Lefty" MacAleer, the M. C. A. work-horse relieved Wilson in the fourth. He was touched for one run and three hits in that frame but held the Abbies scoreless the rest of the way.

Irving MacKinnon with three hits was the batting star. Art Hughes, Arnold MacCallum, Glen Matheson, Freddy Keillor and Joe Coyle each got two base hits.
