The Newfoundland Question.

LONDON, Feb. 10. In the House of Lords, yesterday, replying to the criticism of the Earl of Kimberley regarding the absence of any reference to Newfoundland in the Queen's speech from the Throne, Lord Salisbury said that the present settlement of the question was not due to the action of the Government of Great Britain but to the people of Newfoundland themselves. The address in reply to the speech from the Throne was moved by the Earl of Dudley and was passed by the House of Lords.
