Article Rinderpest XVI, Page 236: Summary: A satisfactory complement fixation test for rinderpest is reported. The antigen is easily produced in large quantities and readily standardized. The titer of the antigen is maintained for long periods when stored frozen. Heating the antigen for sixty minutes at 60c. inactivates the virus, but the antigenicity is unimpaired. The test is of great value in measuring the virus content of eggs used for vaccine production, or seed virus for egg inoculation.

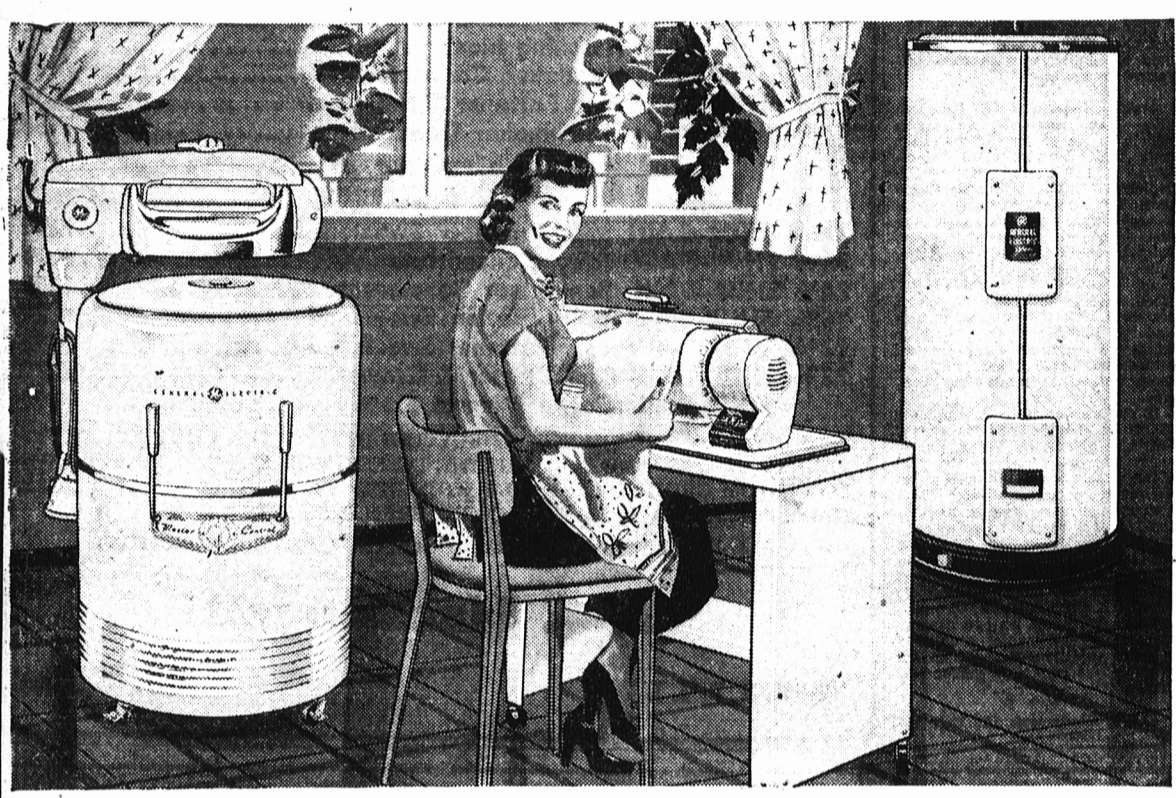
