Meighen Stresses Necessity For Common Front

Ottawa, Sept. 10—Canada must help Britain and its allies in the struggle against totalitarian aggression or the Dominion itself will be in grave danger, Senator Arthur Meighen, Conservative Leader in the Upper House, warned the Senate yesterday.

"If we don't win this war we will be on the banks of the Rhine we'll have to win on the banks of the St. Lawrence and the Mississippi," he declared. "Let us get this into the minds of all our people."

There must be a common front of freedom-loving nations to save all that they hold dear "from destruction by our pagan foes."

If Germany should triumph and Britain and France fall, said Senator Meighen, Germany would not be a tolerant victor. Every British subject in Germany and every British subject in France would be a German slave and the German would be more difficult to stop than it is now.

A united front at the present time was of utmost importance, and deferring controversy, he sought to vest his words with sentiments of assistance, seeking to rally the people to the national cause.

Lapointe Speaks For Quebec Cabinet Ministers

OTTAWA, Sept. 10 (CP)—Justice Minister Lapointe, speaking for himself and all the Quebec Ministers in the Cabinet, told the House of Commons Saturday that they would support wholeheartedly the Government's war policy and that their support would cease only if the Government proposed conscription for overseas service.

Defying those of his fellow French-Canadians who advocate neutrality, the Minister declared that loyalty for Canada in the present war was impossible both from a practical and legal standpoint.

While declaring he and his three ministerial colleagues from Quebec would resist the demand which would come from all parts of Canada to send an expeditionary force overseas.

"Canada to send an expeditionary force overseas," he said.

"(Pension Minister Power, Works Minister Curran and Senator Raoul Dandurand, Minister without portfolio, are the other Quebec Ministers.)

Mr. Lapointe ridiculed the idea put forth in some quarters that there might be a form of "mitigated" or "partial" neutrality.
