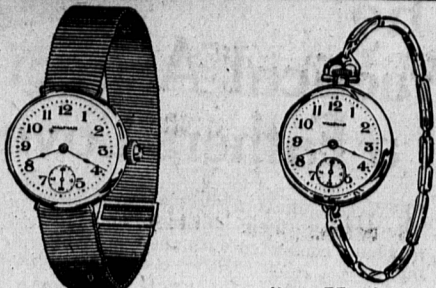

Brenton Dickerson, New Glasgow; Rev. and Mrs. C. E. To mitigate as far as possible, these dangers, the specifications that follow were drawn by a special committee including representative engineers, acting for the American Radio League, American Telephone and Telegraph Company, Radio Corporation of America, Independent Telephone Association and the National Fire Protection Association. This committee places itself on record as considering stations making use of indoor antennae devoid of hazard. Emphasis is also placed upon the fact that most of the fires so far reported as originating with wireless sets, have arisen from lightning brought in from overhead antennae. J.
