

**More Nurses  
Quit Hospital**

HULL, Que. (CP)—The number of nurses who have walked out of Sacred Heart Hospital over a wage dispute rose to 29, with two quitting overnight, union agent Fernand Phillon said Saturday.

Only emergency cases were being admitted to the hospital which has called in registered nursing nuns of the Order of the Providence from Montreal, the Catholic order that runs the hospital.

Mr. Phillon said only 10 full-time nurses remained at work in the hospital that has about 300 patients.

The nurses are seeking a minimum \$225 a month. They now get a starting \$206 and a maximum \$225 after two years experience.

Her many friends and relatives are pleased to have Mrs. Hedley Muttart back among them after being a patient in the Prince County Hospital for a month.

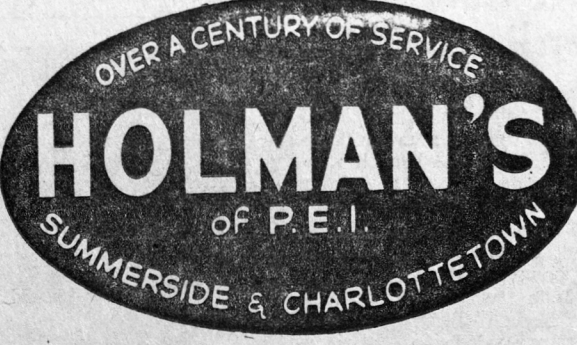

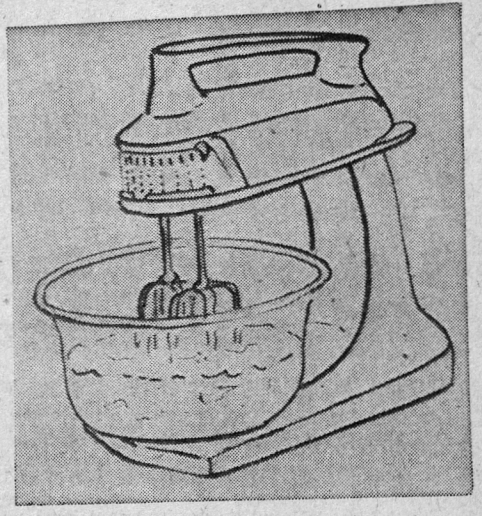

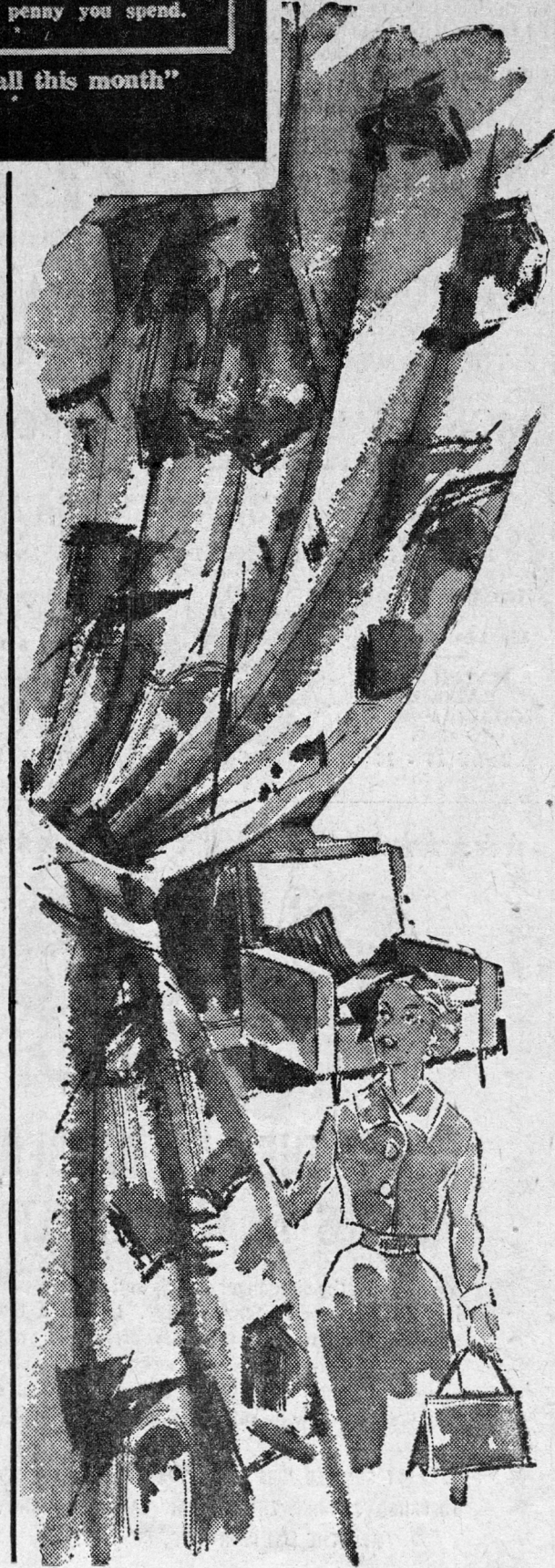
