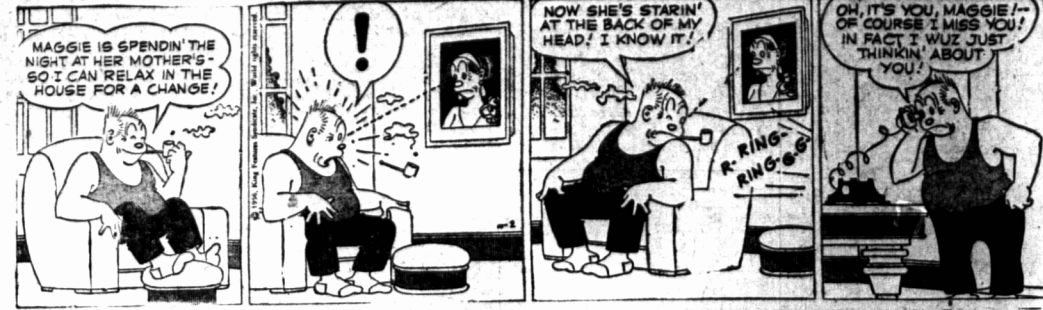

CONTRACT BRIDGE
By B. Jay Becker
(Top Record-Holder in Masters' Individual Championship Play)

QUIZ
You are the dealer, both sides vulnerable, and have opened with One Heart. Your partner, North, has responded with Three Hearts. What do you now bid with each of the following four hands?
1. ♠KQ6432 ♦AKJ72 ♣9 ♠AKJ3
2. ♠K6 ♣AQ874 ♦32 ♠AKJ3
3. ♠73 ♠AKJ9 ♦AQ842 ♠85
4. ♠AJT ♠QJ852 ♠A4 ♠AK9
1. Four notrump. The best final contract depends upon the number of aces partner has. If partner responds with five spades, showing three aces, seven hearts should be bid. If North shows two aces with a five heart response, a small slam may be undertaken.
If North replies five diamonds, the final contract will have to be five hearts, since the opponents have two aces. In all cases, it should be assumed there are no diamond losers because the odds heavily favor North's having either the queen, a singleton or a doubleton.
2. Four clubs. The new suit alerts partner to the possibility of a slam. North's three heart bid usually ranges between 13 and 15 points, including a minimum of four trumps. The 17 high card points plus distribution may be enough to produce a slam (33 points), provided partner does not have a skipper three heart bid. Blackwood does not help. Partner may have a hand with one ace that will make a slam easily, or a hand containing two aces with which the play for a slam is poor. By bidding four clubs, partner is given a chance to sign off at four hearts, if he has a minimum hand, or to co-operate with the slam effort by making 'inv' other bid.
3. Four hearts. The diamond suit must be suppressed because naming it shows interest in a slam, and partner may justifiably carry the bidding to too high a level. A slam should not be seriously considered in view of the minimum nature of the opening bid and the limited values shown by the three heart response. There should be no fear of playing hearts as trump, since North has at least four trumps.
4. Six hearts. This hand adds up to a slam once partner has bid at three hearts. There can be no grand slam (37 points) and it would be wrong to think in terms of playing at less than six.
Nothing much is to be gained by using Blackwood or any other sequence of bids. Any information thus obtained would be more likely to help the opposition.
The budgeon method looks to be more effective than the scientific approach. No more information than absolutely necessary should be given to the enemy.
