### Forgiving and Forgetting.

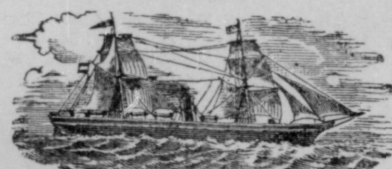
Two little girls were talking together of an injury one of them had received. "You must forgive and forget," said one.
