

Church Council Will Oppose State Lotteries

NIAGARA FALLS, Ont. (CP) State lotteries in Canada will meet continued opposition from members of the Canadian Council of Churches.

Delegates to the closing session of the council's 10th biennial meeting have decided to step up their fight against making gambling legal.

Their attitude was in line with a declaration from the council's social relations department which said: "Christians should speak out in the face of moral and social evils of our day."

The council voted to give support and encouragement to organized labor, to defend and promote the right to organize, to have collective bargaining and insist on adequate legislative safeguards. There could be no discrimination because of sex, race, creed or color, it said.

Council members urged churches to develop a better relationship between French and English in Canada, including learning each other's language.

In other business, Rev. R. L. Seaborn, Anglican bishop of Newfoundland, questioned the bible society's program of continuing to distribute bibles that were no longer in the language people understand.

New Pulp Mill Planned in B.C.

VANCOUVER (CP) — Plans for a \$65,000,000 kraft pulp mill to be partially financed by West German capital have been announced here.

Intercontinental Pulp Ltd., a 10-11 subsidiary of Prince George Pulp and Paper Ltd. and Feldmühle AG of Dusseldorf, said it plans a 600-ton mill in the Prince George area.

31 Canadians Held In Congo

At least 31 Canadians, including 12 children, are reported to be in areas overrun by Congolese rebels in the Congo.

The Canadians are missionaries and their children. Little has been heard from them but they are believed to be in good health.

The missionaries are believed being held hostage in or near the rebel capital of Stanleyville. Two other missionaries — Mr. and Mrs. Colon A. Buckley of Vancouver — are in Uele province, a considerable distance north of Stanleyville and an area which is reported still in the hands of Congolese government forces.

There is no way of knowing precisely how many Canadians are being held hostage by the rebels or whether any have been released. Officials and friends and relatives have received only fragmentary reports from the Congo.

LONDON (Reuters) — A member of Parliament was so angered at a striking poster of a sun-tanned bikini-clad girl with a "wish you were here" smile that he raised the matter in Parliament.

Labor member James Dempsey urged aviation minister Roy Jenkins to give a general direction to the state-owned British Overseas Airways "to improve the moral standard of its trading advertisements."

But Jenkins said it was not part of his duties to censor this aspect of BOAC's activities.

He said he himself did not object to the poster, which showed the girl lying on a beach in the Caribbean.

Members of Parliament cheered Jenkins.

One asked if he could supply the name and address of the young lady, but Jenkins said this was not part of his duties either.
