DAIRY MEETING AT NEW PERTH.

The meeting at New Perth, attended by Prof. Robertson and Mr. T. J. Dillon, yesterday, was one of the most successful yet held in the interest of dairying at that place.

Cyrus Shaw, Esq., President of the New Perth Dairying Company, occupied the chair.

Prof. Robertson, after the meeting was organized, handed each patron of the factory a printed copy of his account for last season's operations, showing in detail what each patron had obtained.

Although some dissatisfaction had prevailed amongst the patrons at the result of last season's work, the explanations given by Prof. Robertson were so reasonable that they were accepted without comment.

Mr. Shaw submitted a report of the operations of the company, and the same was approved and passed.

Professor Robertson and Mr. Dillon then gave interesting addresses on subjects connected with dairying, and were listened to with marked attention.

Professor Robertson intimated that next season some butter-making factories would be instituted in the Province.

On motion of P. J. D. E. Innes, seconded by F. G. Boyer, it was resolved that patrons be paid for milk in accordance with quality as well as quantity.

The fact was testified at this meeting that Mr. Irving, of Vernon River received the largest amount for milk in the Province, that Cyrus Shaw, Esq., was the second, and Hon. Alex. Laird, Belcher, the third.

NEWS NOTES.

The earliest day upon which Easter can possibly fall is March 22nd; the latest is on April 25th. During the present century Easter has only once occurred at the earliest possible date, and that was as long ago as 1818. It has only once within the same period fallen on the latest possible date, and that was in 1886. Only four times previously since the beginning of the century has Easter been so early as it is this year, namely, in 1818, 1845, 1856 and 1883.

The literature of the Junius question will receive an addition in a work Messrs. Longman's are publishing this year.
