

HEATED DEBATE GOES 4 HOURS

P. C. resources minister battles angry truckers

RAIS COMEAU, Que. (CP)—Rene Levesque, outspoken Que. resources minister, faced an angry crowd of 150 truck owners Friday night and told them that "two ministers were making money" during the building of the Hydro-Quebec Bessimis power project in the 1950s.

The mammoth project in individual trucks because it would cost \$350,000 more annually for the next 24 years. The resources minister said \$350,000 would mean work only for some 20 truckers "and they'd find themselves on their backsides again two years later while Hydro-Quebec wouldn't have a cent more of work for its money."

TREATIES DELAY The truckers have threatened to hold up the project if they do not get 50 per cent of the contracts to haul cement to the construction site.

"Down here in Montreal there are guys dying of hunger too—if you're interested."

Mr. Levesque asked the men to "use your sense of responsibility during a visit here July 27-28 by Premier Jean Lesage."

Deformed infant made ward in Ont.

KITCHENER, Ont. (CP)—An armless baby with small, malformed legs, a cleft palate and a probable congenital heart defect has been made a permanent ward of the Waterloo County Children's Aid Society.

Heard said the baby will be placed in a foster home with an experienced foster mother until provision is made for its placement in an institution.

DRUG WITHDRAWN A drug named thalidomide, withdrawn from use in Canada about six months ago, has been blamed for similar malformation among babies whose mothers took the tranquilizer.

The baby's father said outside the court he felt the child's malformation had something to do with pills his wife took during pregnancy.
