The president, Mrs. Robert Matheson presided and opened the meeting by repeating the "Creed" in unison and the singing of the "Ode".

An address of welcome was very cordially extended by Mrs. Jack MacPhee, Long Creek, and graciously responded to by Mrs. Rankine MacLean, Rice Point.

Roll call was answered by representatives from eighteen Institutes and the minutes of the last year's convention were read and approved.

A summarized report of the different Institutes was given by the secretary, Mrs. Roland Buchanan, and these reports bore evidence of the splendid work being done by the different branches.

First Speaker

The first speaker of the afternoon was Mrs. Beecher Hickox, Canoe Cove, who gave an inspiring address on "Education". She said one of the objects of education was the training of character. The student must see the good and go out in the world to make his own life. Co-operation is needed between teacher, department of education and pupils.

They must have a teacher of high moral standards and it is up to the Institutes to make teaching attractive and uphold teachers. Concerning teacher shortage, she said, it was not so much the salaries as criticism from districts and parents, sometimes poor living conditions and poorly kept schools. The teacher's load is too great. She thought May 31st should be set as a deadline for hiring or firing a teacher.

Mrs. Allison MacMillan congratulated her on her splendid talk, also several other ladies.

Mrs. Walter Shaw gave a very interesting talk on the Music Festival. She thought that if there

was a better attendance and more interest taken, teachers and pupils would be much happier. The Music Festival is to encourage the love of good music.

Master Eugene Donahue sang a solo which was much enjoyed and encored.

Mrs. Allan Stewart, Bonshaw, gave a splendid talk on, "Are the Institutes functioning for the purpose for which they were organized?" She said members should keep well informed and give out their knowledge to all women whether they are members or not. The Institutes should not be expected to provide most of the equipment for the schools but should encourage and help any movement that raises the standard of living in the Province, and should spend some of the funds on the halls, cemeteries and churches.

She suggested that the community should be marked, and thought it would be a fine idea to take up with the Travel Bureau. Mrs. Hazen Howard, Cornwall, in a very capable way, mentioned that the Institutes are improving. They are learning home decorating, sewing, cooking, and provide prizes to interest the pupils.

They help renovate the public halls, help in dental clinics, Red Cross, relief or war work, and send boxes and gifts to soldiers. The Drama and Music Festival were started by the Women's Institute in small degrees and are now immense.

A sing-song was enjoyed with Mrs. Hector Currie as organist.

A very interesting talk was given by Mrs. W. E. MacKinnon who spoke on the A. C. W. W. and its work. This was followed by "Fun and Games" by Nine Mile Creek and was much enjoyed.

A sing-song followed led by Mrs. Hector Currie, after which Miss Mary Robin, supervisor, gave an interesting talk and demonstration on color and design, which was very profitable to all. In mixing colors, she stressed using tones and shades that are soft and she told how to make certain shades.

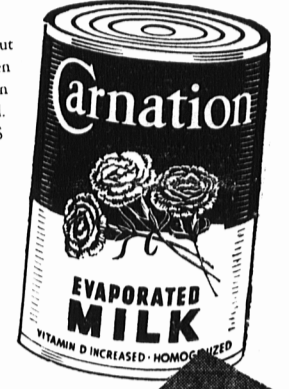

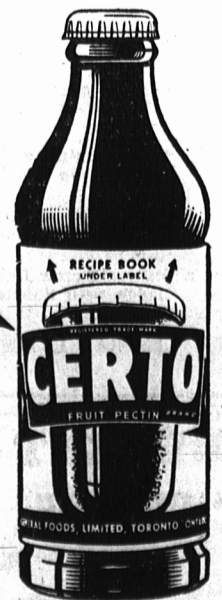
