Local and Other Items.

CITY COUNCIL.—Meeting tonight at the usual hour.

MONTREAL'S EXPENDITURE.—Montreal will have to spend on its municipal services this year a sum of \$3,191,717, or \$169,372 more than during the past twelve months. Of the increase \$96,552 has been appropriated for the streets, which in all will get \$366,856, compared with \$210,304 in 1898.

THAT SEIZED FLOUR.—The American flour seized by the British off the coast of Africa, was manufactured by the Seaboard Milling Co., of Reading, Pa. The shipment consisted of 25,000 barrels, valued at \$125,000. This company has been sending much of its product to South Africa for the past four years.

NOVA SCOTIA APPLES.—Writing to the Halifax Chronicle about the Nova Scotia apple crop, J. E. Starr estimates the fall shipment at 255,000 barrels, valued at \$2.50 per barrel, or \$637,500; for home consumption and shipment to the United States and Maritime Provinces, 150,000 barrels, valued at \$1.60 per barrel, or \$235,000, making a total value of \$862,500.

FOUND AT BLOMIDON.—Mr. Charles Sweeney, of Middleton, recently sent a large specimen of the quartz crystals found at Blomidon to New York, to be properly cut for a ring setting. The cut stone weighs about eighteen carats, is perfectly clear and produces a brilliant sparkle that would put nearly all diamond imitations to shame.—Bridgetown Monitor.

DIED IN THE PULPIT.—With the death of 1899 but a few minutes distant, with his seventy-fifth year ending, and while thanking the Lord for the blessings of the year that was passed the Rev. Jonathan K. Peck, of Kingston, Pa., fell dead before a large congregation at the Kingston Methodist Episcopal church. Mr. Peck was in the pulpit leading the watchnight services. The church was crowded. Mr. Peck was in the middle of an eloquent sermon on the closing of the year, and he had alluded feelingly to the prominent ministers of the Wyoming Conference who had died. He was on the point of ending a touching tribute to his well-remembered father, and there were many moist eyes in the congregation. Mr. Peck had always expressed a wish to die in the pulpit, and the Rev. Mr. Murdoch, the pastor, in announcing him, said that he was one of the oldest ministers of the Conference and might soon be called to a higher place.

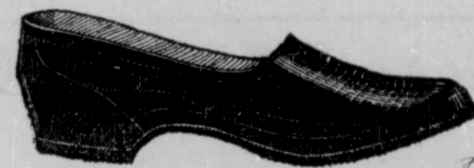

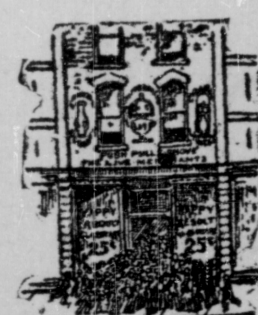
