Atlantic Liberal Strongholds Fall

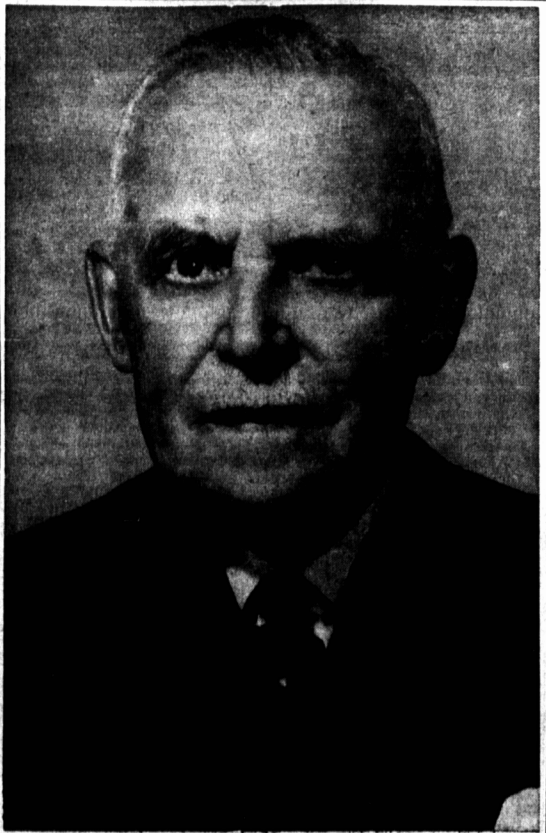
HALIFAX (CP) — Progressive Conservatives swept through long-time Atlantic Liberal strongholds in Monday's federal election.

No Coalition, Coldwell Says

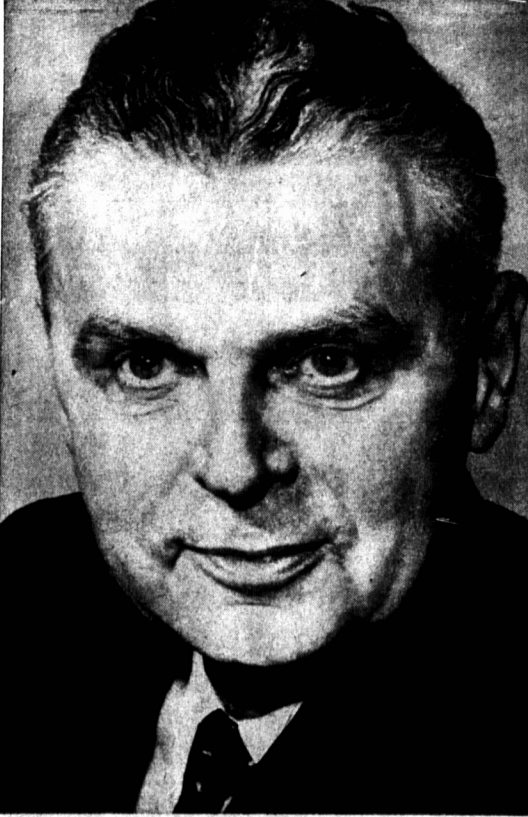
ROSETOWN, Sask. (CP)—CCF Leader Coldwell said Monday night his party will not participate in any coalition in the next Parliament.

In Normal Course Will Be Asked To Form Next Gov't

By JOHN LeBLANC Canadian Press Staff Writer The Progressive Conservatives under John Diefenbaker will form Canada's new government.

Normal procedure will be for Governor-General Massey to call on the 61-year-old Mr. Diefenbaker—party leader only since last December—to form a government to succeed Rt. Hon. Louis St. Laurent's group, since he would have the largest Commons block.

GAINS IN MARITIMES

In Newfoundland, they gained two seats from the Liberals. In Nova Scotia, they took six from the Liberals and one from the CCF. In New Brunswick, they had won at least one Liberal seat, and in P.E.I. they gained three.

MINISTERS FALL

Seven Liberal ministers had toppled by this time, along with two parliamentary assistants. The casualties included Finance Minister Harris, Labor Minister Gregg, Justice Minister Garson, Revenue Minister McCann, Works Minister Winters, Veterans Minister Laopinte and Associate Defence Minister Hellyer, recently appointed to the cabinet.
