SCOTT ACT.—Before Stipendiary-Magistrate Blanchard, at Georgetown, last evening, four Scott Act cases were disposed of. James Robertson, of Cardigan, was fined \$50 or two months imprisonment; Mrs. James Robertson, his wife, was also fined \$50 or two months. Henry Thompson, of Sturgeon, was fined \$50 or two months. The summons against Mrs. Hichey, of Georgetown, was dismissed.

### MEANS OF SAVING LIFE AT SEA.

Sir,—The loss of the steamer La Bourgoigne and over 500 of crew and passengers shows clearly the needs existing for better and more effective means of saving life at sea. The writer has for many years past striven to impress on the government of Canada the need of legislation requiring a periodical inspection of all ships' boats, to see that they shall be staunch and strong, and fitted with air chambers, oars, and a sail fastened to them, bread and water boxes, to be kept always filled, a compass some cheap signaling device, rods along the bottom, to which passengers could cling in case of a capsize, and a can of oil. To this, add in the case of passenger steamships, a better arrangement of boat davits and a wreck drill, something like the fire drill as shown in the public schools. Had such a system been in use on the ill-fated Bourgoigne, hundreds who now lie on the bottom of the Atlantic would have been alive today.

Doubtless, if such a system of life-saving equipment was brought into use by the government of Canada, its adoption by the maritime nations would be only a question of a very limited time. This matter was brought to the personal attention of the responsible minister nearly two years ago. He has been importuned at intervals since, but virtually no results have followed. Several influential men have expressed their appreciation of the efforts of the writer, but so far these efforts have been barren of results. The writer seeks no profit or reward, and expects abuse and misrepresentation; however, public opinion is stronger than governments. Will the press generally oblige the writer by reprinting this letter?
