Hornet Rifle Offer To End By Dec. 31

OTTAWA (CP)—The government's offer of reimbursement to persons returning the Hornet rifle, possession of which was declared illegal in 1960 act Parliament, will end Dec. 31, Defence Production Minister O'Hurley announced Friday.

When the federal government announced three years ago this month it proposed to amend the Criminal Code to make possession of the rifles illegal, 1,224 had been sold to the public and 1,577 were in hands of dealers.

They had become surplus to army needs and had been turned over to Crown Assets Disposal Corporation for sale to the public.

Unlike a normal rifle, the Hornet survival rifle is constructed with a pistol grip and an easily detachable metal brace which takes the place of the wooden stock on a standard rifle. Its barrel is only 14 inches long.

Some police forces had objected to the compact weapon being in the hands of the public.

STORIES DIFFER. Versions differed as to how the burglar alarm was set off. One report said a teller tripped the alarm; another said it could be that the drawers had been pulled out. Still another said certain conditions inside the vault.

As the police car drove up soon after the alarm, two of the bandits ran out the front door to join the lookout man. The other ran to the back of the bank and dived through a window—crashing through a venetian blind, the pane of glass and wire wires.

The holdup was the third involving fatalities this year in and near Montreal. Two bandits were killed last May in an attempted bank robbery at St. Sebastien, 30 miles north of Montreal. A policeman was wounded.

Two other bandits were killed last July following the \$50,000 robbery of a bank at Rockland. The bandits were shot in a suburb of Montreal. Two and two others were surrendered and one escaped.

Twenty-three policemen have been killed while on duty on Montreal Island in the last 77 years. It is estimated 100 are trying to quell a brawl, one in chasing a speeding car and four in traffic accident.
