pyloroplasty — making the pylorus (opening from stomach to small intestine) smaller, so that stomach lining cannot be washed or swept out of the stomach into the small intestine. If other conditions call for more extensive surgery, such as removal of almost the entire stomach, then these other conditions should decide extent of operation as prolapse of itself is not necessarily dangerous.

This is the third time I have written about the prolapse of the stomach lining because it has some of the symptoms of ulcer and cancer and an X-ray film should be made. In most cases, as noted above, surgical treatment is not necessary.

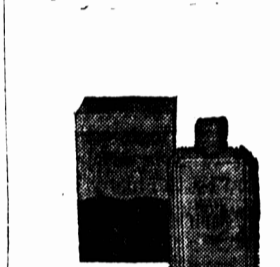
