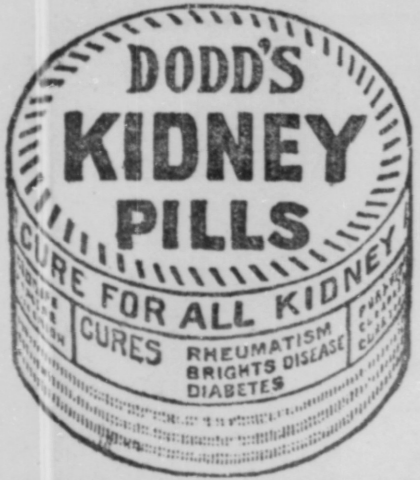

For **Business Men**

Choosing a Life Work.

The principal of a boys' school was speaking to the pupils about their future life. He asked: "How many of you have decided what you will be when you become men?"

There was no reply. He then asked that any boy who had selected his future occupation should hold up his hand. Out of the hundred, ten boys did so. Ninety had no idea what they were going to do in this world, for the world or for themselves. He then asked those who had given the matter some thought, but were undecided, to raise their hand. Fifteen hands went up. Seventy-five boys out of the hundred, between the ages of fourteen and twenty, had never thought about their future occupation. Considering that, how could they expect to excel in anything or to make a mark in the world? Yet, doubtless, some of them, when men, will complain that wealth and honors are unevenly divided in this world.

The way to have honor, to become any body of importance, to be a power among men, is not to envy another person, but to fix the eyes upon that goal and work for it, choosing early the path which leads to that eminence.

A young man desired to be a clergyman. He was the only child of a poor widow, who could not educate him. A wealthy gentleman, becoming interested in him, offered to defray the expenses of his education. He gladly accepted, prepared for college, and had just entered, when the gentleman failed, losing every dollar. The young man, of course had to leave college, but he did not give up his determination to enter the ministry. He taught

music that year, saved his money, and entered college. Continuing to teach in the college town, he supported himself through his whole college course.

I know of another young man, who, with every opportunity to pursue one thing, changes his mind and his occupation about as often as he does his coat. He never gets above the drudgery part, and is only earning three dollars a week, sometimes nothing, for there are frequent resting-places at the change of his occupations. Who could expect him to make a success of his life?

No matter what profession or trade you take up, you have to work, and work harder and under more difficulties at the outset than further on. The boy who wants to shirk this necessary drudgery is not made of the stuff which conquers in life.

Above all things avoid being a "Jack-of-all-trades." Some men have a genius for so many things that they cannot give enough attention to one thing to master it. I know of a youth of nearly twenty who can play and sing, mend a clock, a music box, an organ, invent little things, make coffee, draw, and—why I hardly know anything he cannot do, and the consequence is, he is not doing anything. If anyone wants work, "fixed" he is the one who fixes it, but his life is not going to be "fixed" in any direction. In direct contrast to him is a companion of his who has already served several years at his trade, and will some day turn out a first class carpenter.

Judicious advertising can work wonders, but it can't overcome the effect of boorish personality, compensate for bad store management, take the place of lack of capital, cover misrepresentations, or save a business from bankruptcy when on the verge of ruin. The physician dislikes to be called in the last stages of a patient's serious illness, when there remains but one chance in a thousand for the ailing one's recovery. A business of-

ten reaches that stage where nothing can save it, yet resort is taken to an advertising tonic. Large quantities are given in order to sustain life for a time. This mode of treatment seems often to justify the prevailing public opinion that the business came to its death by an overdose of advertising, when an inquest would sustain a verdict to the effect that it came to untimely end through need of timely advertising. If called in time, the physician could have studied symptoms and administered medicines that would doubtless have warded off insidious disease and made a well man of the patient. If Dr publicity had received a timely call to attend the ailing business, judicious treatment might have bridged over impending disaster, built up the broken down constitution and saved Dr P.'s reputation.—Exchange.
