NEW YORK (AP) - Stock market prices declined today Monday as trading dwindled in the slowest pace since last July. GM was the most active stock, up 1/4 at 32 1/2 on 30,000 shares, a moderate total for a volume leader.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks declined 90 to 246.00. American Tobacco was the second most active stock, falling 1 1/2 to 34 on 30,000 shares. Reynolds Tobacco, unchanged at 21 1/2 on 27,000 shares.

International Nickel and Granby Mining declined 1/2 each on the Canadian bid, while Aluminum Ltd. and Hudson Bay Mining lost 1/4 each. Molycorp Porcupine was up 1/4 and Dome Mines 1/2.

American Exchange prices faded after early gains. Canadian Marconi was off 1/4, and Jupiter 1/2, while Brazilian Traction gained 1/4.
