

Gallant Ancestor Came Here 720

The following story on the history of the Gallant family in this province is written by Professor J. H. Blanchard, Charlottetown, the province's best known writer of Acadian history. It is written in connection with the reunion of the Gallants planned here early in August.

Michel Hache (surnamed Gallant), ancestor of the Gallants, was born at Trois-Rivières, Province of Quebec, in 1669. He was educated in that city and came to Acadia as a young man to be the secretary of Sieur de la Vallée, Lord of the Seigneurie of Beauséjour (now Amherst, N. S.), with headquarters at Beauséjour. There in 1699, he married Anne Cormier, daughter of Thomas Cormier and Madeleine Grouard. They had a family of 12 children: Seven sons and five daughters.

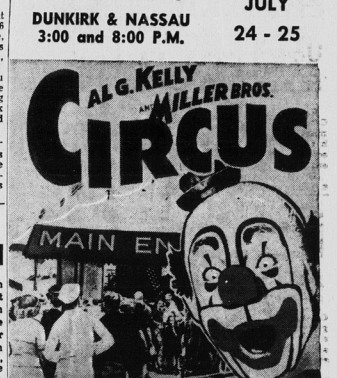
