Let him remember that public schools, art galleries, jails, penitentiaries, almshouses, reformatories have not stopped this traffic; purity, nobility, literature, character and the life service of good men have only partially stayed its progress, then in the name of common sense let us have less doubts and a court set by which right shall not be forever on the scaffold and wrong forever on the throne.

It is within the province of our Local Parliament to take this matter up on the above lines, the laws of regulation are not fundamental, and to my mind cannot interfere with the federal act. Public exigencies are the master of all such laws (although as I have said on a former occasion, laws exist in vain if it be who makes them have not courage to find means to defend them.
