DURING the week ending September 6, 1411 cattle, 4290 sheep and 190 horses were shipped from Montreal to England.

THE Newfoundland fisheries have been above the average. At the Labrador the catch averages 110 to 120 quintals per boat, and 700 to 800 quintals. Herrings are plentiful, and mackerel, which disappeared from the coast 25 years ago, are occasionally met with.

WE are pleased to see that one of our Island horses—Mr. A. Holmes' "Lookout"—has been doing good work in New Brunswick as well as in Nova Scotia. At Moosepath on Wednesday last he took first money in the 250 class after trotting six heats.

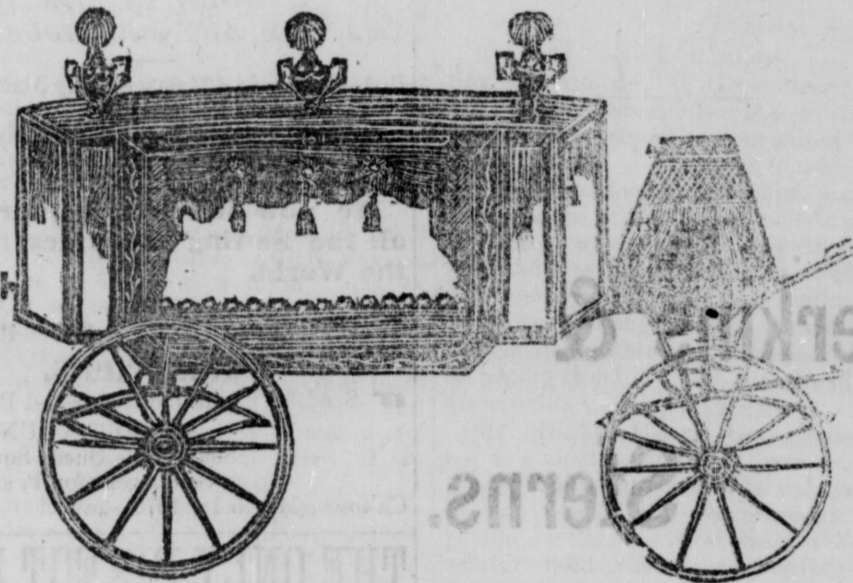
