### Psychiatry, Religion Not In Conflict Maintains Doctor

"Psychiatry and Religion are not at variance" stated Dr. Joan C. Theriault of Charlottetown in his address to the Basilia Laymen's Association at their first communion breakfast held at the Community Centre Sunday. In his talk entitled "Catholicism and Psychiatry" Dr. Theriault said that though some schools of psychiatry ignored Religion and God, this in no means was true of psychiatry in general. "Psychiatry," he said, "is that branch of medicine that deals with signs, symptoms, causes and treatment of the mentally and emotionally ill."

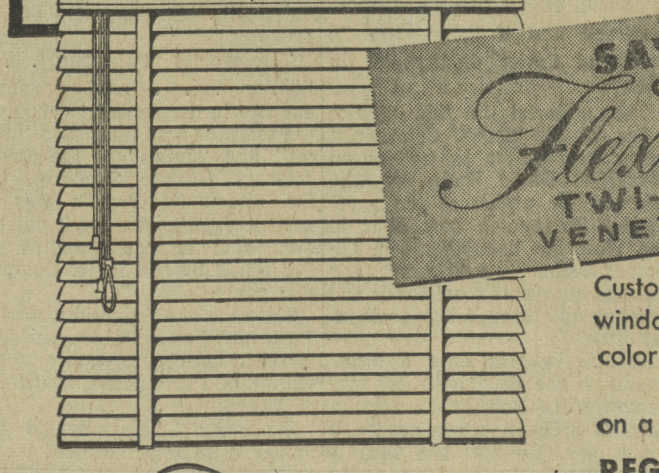
