## NEW BRUNSWICK GENERAL ELECTION

To Take Place Forthwith.

A SHARP AND VIGOROUS CONTEST EXPECTED.

Mr. McSweeney's Elevation to the Senate.

ST. JOHN, N. B., Jan. 28.—It is accepted as a certainty that the Legislature will be dissolved on Monday, if not before. The Government party has issued a call for a convention in three constituencies, beginning on Tuesday, so that uncertainty is over.

The contest will be sharp and vigorous. Hon. Mr. Blair has agreed to take over the Canada Eastern railway and make it part of the Intercolonial.

A second Doukhobor death took place here yesterday.

ST. JOHN, Jan. 23.—Dr. Wellon, of Halifax, has been asked by the local opposition to run against Premier Emmerson in Albert County. It is reported for a certainty that Peter McSweeney, of Moncton, has got the senatorial vacancy made by the death of Senator Auams.

GEN. EGAN'S DEFENCE.

Mental Unsoundness as Result of General Miles's Charges.

## THE YELLOW FLAG AT HALIFAX

Case of Smallpox Among the Doukhobors.

WILL BE QUARANTINED AT HALIFAX SEVERAL WEEKS.

HALIFAX, Jan. 28.—When the steamship Lake Superior, came to quarantine last evening, the yellow flag was flying at the fore top mast. During the passage there had been three deaths among the Doukhobors, one from small-pox, a child eight years of age who died four days ago.

No other case has developed since, but the physicians fear that there may be new cases in a day or two.

The Doukhobors will be quarantined for some weeks.

GOOD TEMPLARS MEETING

Prohibition Wanted—Scott Act Fines Other Matters

The meeting of the Grand Lodge of the Independent Order of Good Templars held in this city yesterday, was well attended, and the proceedings were of special interest and importance to members of the Order.

After the appointment of the usual committees the reports of the Grand Chief Templar and Grand Secretary were read. The Chief Templar, in his report, referred to the excellent work done by the Good Templars in connection with the recent Plebiscite on Prohibition, and spoke of the splendid vote polled throughout the Province. In this connection he recommended that some influence be brought to bear upon the Parliament of Canada to have a prohibition law passed. He also recommended that some steps be taken to have fines under the Canada Temperance Act justly imposed instead of making all offences first ones, as in his opinion the course pursued was no better than High license. He suggested also that a committee be appointed to secure information regarding the work done by the prosecutors.

The report of the Grand Secretary showed a slight decrease in membership. But as the figures were from the 1st November, some increase had been made since then.

At the afternoon session the Grand Lodge Degree was conferred on five representatives.

The several committees appointed at the earlier session reported, and some of the reports were discussed at length before they were adopted.

W. McKinnon, L. U. Fowler and W. H. Bears were appointed a committee to secure information regarding the work of the prosecutors, in accordance with the suggestion of the Grand Chief Templar.

The Executive was authorized to change the time and place of holding the annual session (if need be) to secure the attendance of Hon. Joseph Mallas, R. W. G. Templar, who is to visit Canada this year. At the evening session some routine business was disposed of.

## THE MAILS LYING AT SACKVILLE

A Worse Condition Than Ever.

OUTGOING MAILS DELAYED EIGHTEEN HOURS.

A Job for Liberal Voters in New Brunswick at Our Expense.

SACKVILLE, N. B., Jan. 28.—The new arrangements made here by the Government for the conveyance of the Island mails from the Cape will be bad for the Island people. Yesterday the Island mails arrived here too late for the Quebec express and laid here all night and will not leave till to-day at noon, eighteen hours later than by the old arrangement.

All the Island mails are transferred between here and the capes by teams, and mails from the Island will generally lay here over night.

The change was made at the instance of the Liberal machine here.

Senator Wood tried to meet the Government's wishes in this matter, but certain people here wanted the job of hauling and the Islanders will suffer in consequence.
