MISS KRUPP'S MANY PROPOSALS

BERLIN, May 19.—Since the statement of the engagement of Miss Bertha Krupp, the richest woman in the world, to an unknown suitor, has been published, the fact has developed that in addition to the proposal, which she has accepted, the German heiress received 362 proposals. This does not include offers from some thousand or more who were suitors who have sent letters to Miss Krupp. Among the 362 eligible suitors who offered themselves to share in the Krupp millions were twelve royal princes from various reigning families, eight dukes, seventy-five counts, nineteen viscounts, sixty-four barons, and thirty-eight noblemen of lesser titles. Three cabinet ministers, six high State dignitaries, sixteen generals, four Ambassadors, ten noted literary men, seventeen painters of renown, eleven poets who are well recognized in the world of letters, and two American millionaires.
In view of the many proposals received by the young heiress public interest is greatly aroused as to the identity of the man who has succeeded in winning Miss Krupp.

A WOMAN SPY IN GERMAN CELL

LEIPZIG, May 19.—Zinaida Smolskianoff who has been sentenced to fifteen months imprisonment, to be followed by expulsion from Germany, is a beautiful young woman, who for five years has been operating very successfully in the interests of the Russian Foreign Office.
Engaged at a salary of \$10,000 a year, she used her arts and charms to such good purpose that she was able to supply the Czar's government with more than fifty important military secrets. These she had extracted by subtle fascination from about a hundred German officials and military officers.
All this time she was moving in the highest circles of German society, but now she has been found to be the cleverest spy Germany has ever had to deal with.

CONSCRIPTION FOR THE NAVY

LONDON, May 19.—In the House of Lords the Earl of Wemyss and March, Conservative, called attention to the question of home defence. He asserted that the country was practically without an army and that there were not sixty up-to-date guns in the country. The question he said would be solved if the government had the courage to adopt the system of compulsory service at home and voluntary service abroad.

The Earl of Portsmouth, Parliament secretary for the war office, replying said the government had a monopolization scheme under which it was hoped it could mobilize its forces for defence as quickly as any continental power. Further schemes had been prepared for the defence of British ports which the speaker confidently anticipated would be placed in a position to resist any sudden attack. Plans for the rebuilding of the huge corporation will be adopted today and it is now expected that all the preliminaries will be completed this week and the work of advancing \$100,000,000 or more for the reconstruction of the destroyed city will begin within thirty days.

HIGH TIDES IN PETITCODIAC

MONCTON, May 19.—High tides are doing considerable damage along the river, and river front. Numerous dykes have been broken and large acres of marshland flooded. Along the local river front, numerous wharves have been submerged, and quantities of movable articles washed away. The water rose almost as high as the wharf track of the I. C. R. Along Hall's Creek about forty or fifty feet of dyke enclosing G. R. Jones marsh, was carried away and the marsh flooded. Other marshes at the foot of Robinson street to the depth of several inches were covered with water. The upper end of the interval along Jonathan Creek was inundated by the back water caused by the exceptionally high tides.
