National Institute on Mental Retardation
The National Institute on Mental Retardation is offering awards to students registered in graduate studies at a Canadian university, and planning a career either directing in mental retardation, or an assoc-

iated professional field. The type A award offers one year of financial support ranging up to \$6,000 plus one week period of orientation training at the National Institute on Mental Retardation. Awards are not renewable but candidates may apply for second year of support. DEADLINE FEBRUARY 19, 1979

Rhodes Scholarships
A Rhodes Scholarship is tenable at the University of Oxford. It may be held for a maximum of three years. Since, however, the majority of Rhodes Scholars obtain standing which enables them to take a degree in two years, appointments are made for two years in the first instance. The stipend of a Rhodes Scholarship consists of a direct payment to the university and the scholar's College of approved fees, plus a

maintenance allowance which is paid directly to the scholar at the rate of approximately 2,010 (pounds) per annum. DEADLINE OCTOBER 25

IOE Scholarships
To honour the memory of the men and women who gave their lives for Canada in World Wars I and II, these Memorials were established to provide scholarships for post-graduate study in History, Economics, Constitutional Government, the Humanities or any subject vital to the interests of the commonwealth. DEADLINE DECEMBER 10.

ELIZABETH COUSINS LARGE MEMORIAL TRUST FUND
Those students entering their Junior or Senior year in Home Economics at UPEI or a UPEI graduate proceeding to graduate study in Home Economics or a related field, are eligible. DEADLINE OCTOBER 20.
