### STORES OF MONTE CARLO.

Some of them True, Many False, but All Highly Interesting.

But who should this be? A man who had lived for years at Monte Carlo; he had passed a score of seasons there; he had plenty of money; he went to the Casino every day and every evening, and he never plays a cent. It is his occupation in life to be an observer of things and to mark the comings and goings of the kind. In the summer he will mark them at Aix-les-Bains, at Lausanne, or at Trouville. He knows everything about the life of the Casino, and he has seen what Russian princesses pawned her diamonds last week, and what Cuban sugar-planter did not die of apoplexy at the Hotel Caprice last Wednesday. "He was a fool, sir," quoth Mr. Spectator. "Why didn't he go to the Administration? Why didn't he make his declaration? They knew well enough that he had lost 200,000 francs in the course of ten days. They would have paid his travelling and hotel expenses, and he would have been free to go to the matter of that. He was a fool, sir."

Mr. Spectator went on to explain that when a cleaned-out player makes his declaration of bankruptcy to the Administration, he is given a sum of money sufficient to defray his journey by railway to the place whence he came from Monte Carlo to London, and he is given a ticket for the matter of that. He mentioned one case in which a whole family of five persons were allowed fifteen francs apiece to take them from Monte Carlo to London, and he mentioned another case in which the recipient should not re-enter the Casino unless he or she received the Administration for their outlay. In the latter case, he had seen a party of a lady, who had not gone further than Nice, received some weeks afterwards a handsome remittance from England. He mentioned one case in which a party of five persons were allowed fifteen francs apiece to take them from Monte Carlo to London, and he mentioned another case in which the recipient should not re-enter the Casino unless he or she received the Administration for their outlay.

### LUDWIG VAN BEETHOVEN.

Of the first eight Symphonies of Beethoven, the favorite among persons of small musical culture is that known as the "Pastoral," and the very things in it which give them the most pleasure are just those which the cultured hearer would most like to strike out. Now, of this form of art (for a symphony is but a sonata lengthened and widened, not always deepened), of this most difficult art, Beethoven is, beyond doubt, the greatest master that has yet appeared. In it he has exceeded his predecessors; and what is more extraordinary still, he remains unequalled, perhaps unapproached, by any of his successors. Like all great geniuses, he worked out his own purposes in his own way. He is said to have spent hours, days, weeks or it might be months in the elaboration of his score; but his process was the reverse of most artists. It consisted not in putting in but in cutting out effects often beautiful in themselves but which he thought or knew would come into contact with others. The works of Beethoven present many examples of startling harmonic progression; so many indeed, that in inferior hands they would soon cease to startle, and still had been regarded as the work of other, so-called musicians and are utterly rejected for the want of either instruction, intelligence or it may be ignorance on the part of the performer.

But the time will come, I do most sincerely hope, when only classical music will be acknowledged. This will be welcomed by all true lovers of music.

To those who do not understand and therefore do not appreciate Beethoven's works, or those of any great composer or I would say study them, look at them, and listen to them until you do.

Beethoven's sufferings (for he certainly was not a man without any) were relieved by the hand of death on March 26th, 1827, aged 57, his end being hastened by the cruel conduct of an ungrateful nephew.
