TORONTO Maple Leafs and Chicago Black Hawks have differed: thoughts in mind as they take to the ice tonight in the second of the Stanley Cup finals.

Punch Imlach's gang has the notion of pulling out another decision and thereby going into Chicago for Toronto's third game with a 2-0 edge. Hawks, on the other hand, are trying to correct themselves that Tuesday's action was all a mistake and that tonight would find the series decided at one game apiece.

They did everything about right and left little doubt as to their superiority. Hawks never got much opportunity to get more into the Leafs' shutout than all the way. The visitors did have a bit of an edge in it was Toronto's Johnny Bower kept the homesters in there until they really broke free.

Folks haven't seen such quick checking for quite awhile. The Leafs also were ahead in this department as their blows had more telling effect. Dick Duff started things and the peppery net stopped all evening. His choice for Gordie Howe as the game's top star was indeed richly deserved.

CHICAGO never got the chance to show the Toronto fans those pretty patterns they displayed against Montreal. Leafs kept breaking up their attack all night and Bobby Hull was shooting any loose pucks that might have been his.

This doesn't mean of course that these players will not shine at all in this Stanley Cup final. We aren't trying to say this at all. We aren't glossing one bit about this opening victory which we all know is a fluke.

But we do know that the Leafs could come through with another triumph tonight and that the Hawks' defense will be a little better than they were in the first game.

ONE thing that pleased us particularly was the play of the Maple Leafs' defense. These rearguards played a solid game and gave Johnny Bower some trouble. The Hawks' defense looked weak in comparison. We have been maintaining that Chicago, despite the excellent play of its forwards, was never correct in this game against Leafs on Tuesday.

We will admit we haven't seen Leafs defense play a better game all year. They were certainly better than they were in their excursions by the Hawks over that blue line. Up front the Toronto forwards were going both ways with real gusto and the combination just proved to be the better team.

How Long Can It Last?

FOLKS are wondering just how long the teams can keep up this bruising type of hockey.

That's a hard question to answer. Our opinion is that Toronto should be able to outlast the Hawks on that score but it's purely an opinion. We have the idea that Leafs can outsurge the Pious crew any day they choose. Tonight the Hawks might surprise us by trumping the Leafs all over the Garden.

"Once again we agree with Mike Hennessy (and we don't like doing it) that the Hawks' defense is the key to their success. If the defense is much more than they are, they will win. If the defense is not, they will lose. Leafs, of course, hope Hull continues this style of play. In fact Imlach is hoping that the entire Hawk outfit gives a similar performance to that of the Leafs in the first game.

Columnist Reviews Damage To Island Fishing Dams

The blizzard that commenced during the afternoon of March 23, and piled six to eight inches of slushy snow in the mountains and valleys, set the stage for the worst flood conditions in this province in living memory.

Before this storm broke there was a considerable depth of snow on the woods. At the foot of forest undergrowth, Toronto residents that day were surprised to find that the snow was not only melting but was also running down the hills. It was a remarkable and unexpected deluge reminiscent of the days of the flood.

Especially mild weather conditions in the days following the March 30 the temperature registered in the fifties. On Sunday evening the temperature was in the sixties. The weather was due for a shock when I saw the dam all night. I noted that the bridge on the Trans Canada was not able to carry the water off and a veritable lake was forming that was within inches of the gravel highway that borders the river. A veritable ocean of water was roaring down the by-pass and yet at one point in the embankment a wall of water was seeping over. On Monday morning the situation looked hopeless. A huge mass of water, 40 feet wide was rushing over the embankment on the Crosby bridge. The water was totally knee deep in eight inches from the top of the bridge on the Trans Canada and five feet deep over the road that borders the river.
