SOURIS — John Batieste Vienneau of Shippon, N.B., charged with having aboard a Canadian vessel an otter trawl of which the mesh was not regulation size pleaded guilty in Magistrate's court here yesterday and was fined \$50 and costs or 15 days. The accused was consoling by Vernon Fraser, Magistrate James B. Johnston, QC, presided.

In two other cases prosecuted by the fisheries department, William Sutherland Carter, Souris, charged with having in his possession 19 small lobsters, pleaded guilty and was fined \$10 and costs or five days. On a second charge of possession of 57 small lobsters, Carter pleaded not guilty and the case was adjourned until Aug. 21 to set a date for hearing.

Roger Carl Francis, Fortune, charged with driving while impaired pleaded not guilty and his case was adjourned until Aug. 14 to set a date for hearing. On a similar charge Patrick Raymond Sweeney, Elmira, pleaded not guilty and also had his case adjourned until Aug. 14.
