ditions. Your step-children were 10 and 8 years old. How could anyone expect you to be fully experienced in housekeeping or child care?

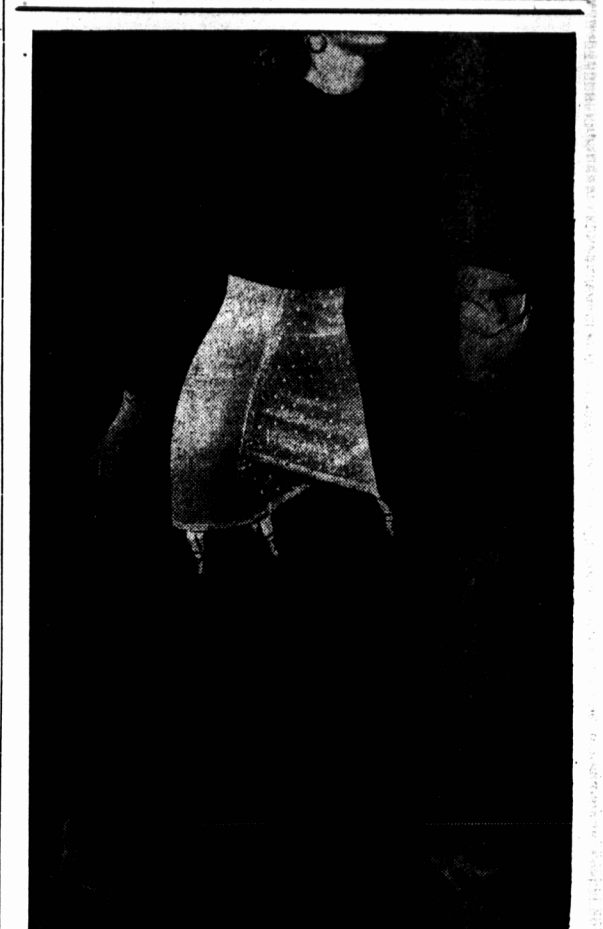
