

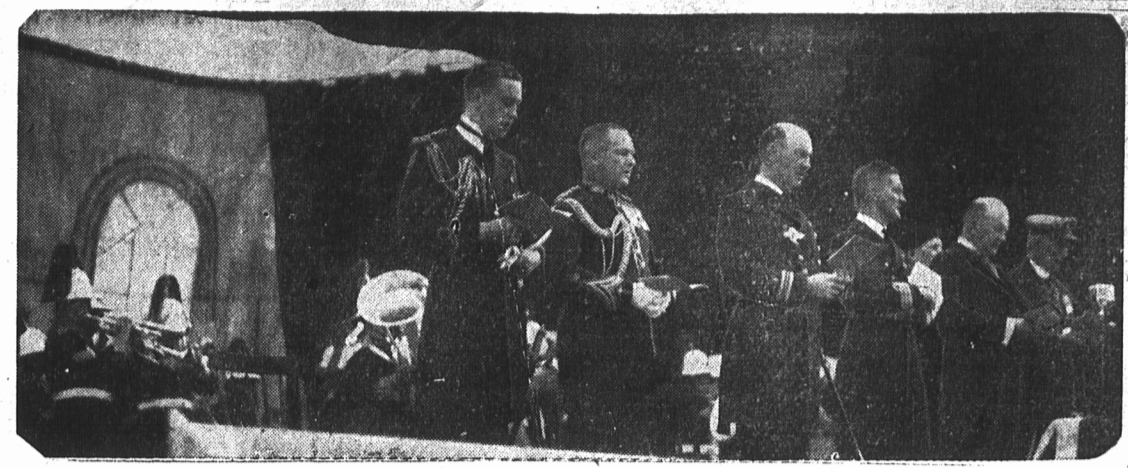

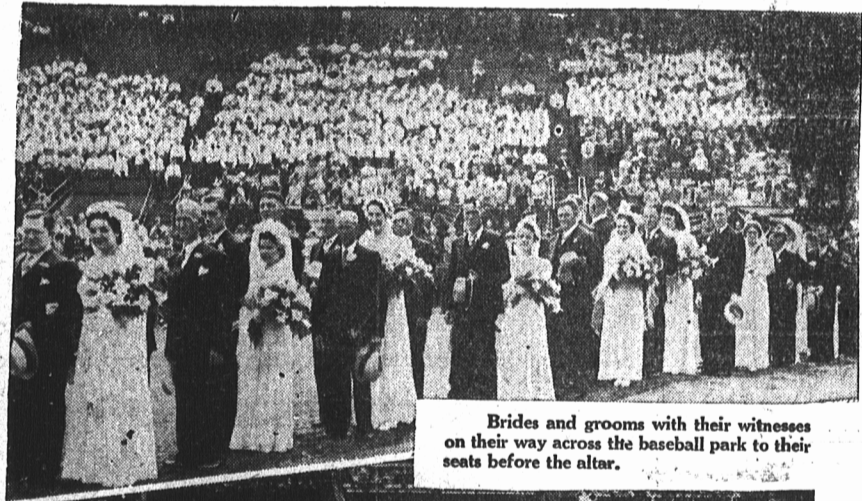

WHERE 105 COUPLES PARTICIPATED IN MASS MARRIAGE AT MONTREAL BALL PARK



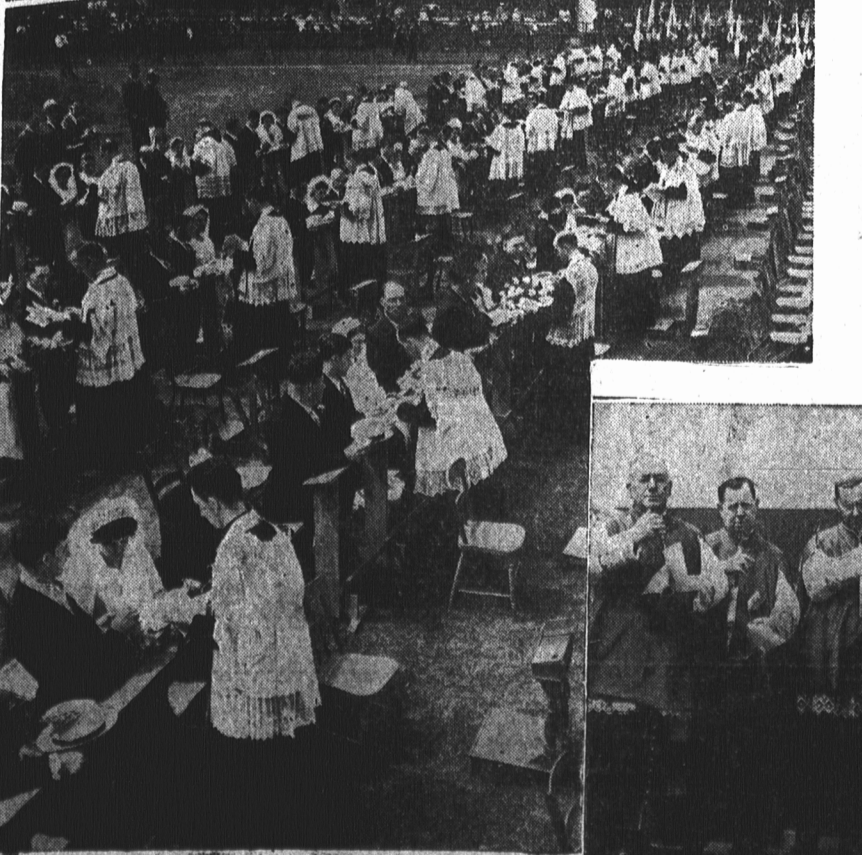
