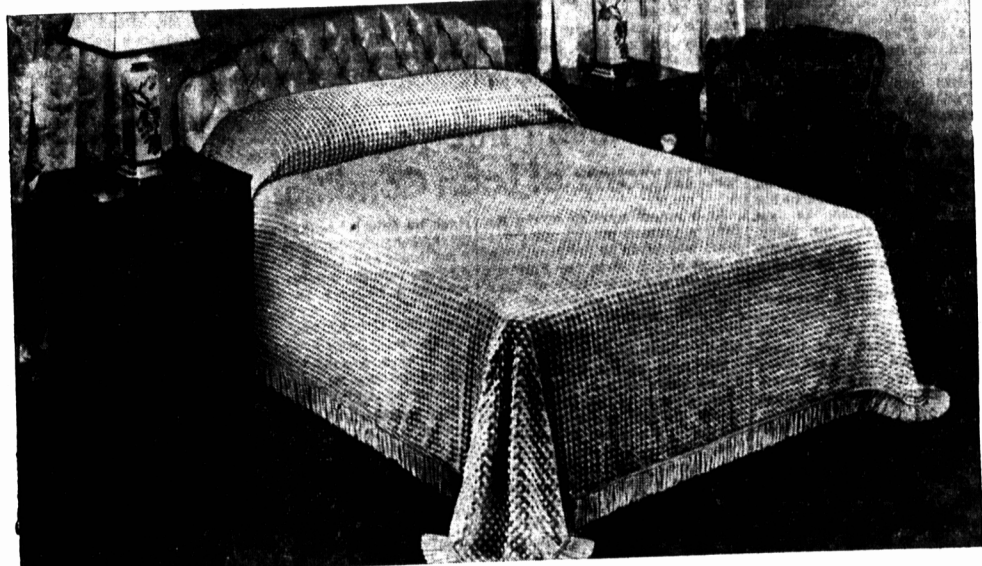
### KINSMEN MAKE TV PRESENTATION TO POLIO CENTRE

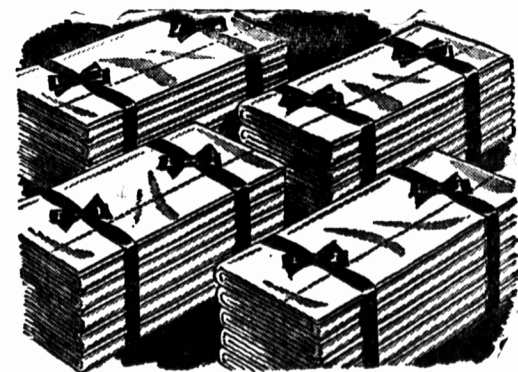
