



Civic Employees Hear Address

At the regular monthly meeting of the Civic Employees Union Local 501 the president A.J. Dowling presided. John F. MacMillan, Maritime representative of the National Union of Public Employees, was present and gave a very interesting and first hand picture of the labour situation in Newfoundland. The reports of the various committees were given and all showed a very active interest being taken in the welfare of the union. The entertainment committee

was highly commended for the capable manner in which duties were performed regarding the banquet and dance which was held recently in the Community Centre. One highlight of the banquet was the presence of the National Director of the National Union of Public Employees, R.P. Rintoul, who addressed the members and their guests. The members unanimously voted to subscribe the sum of \$1 per member in accordance with the request of the labor congress to the Newfoundland strike fund. Preliminary discussion regarding the new agreement with the city council and water commissioners were entered into. The new agreement is to be presented shortly and will replace the present contract which expires in the near future.

Ch'town Man Draws Term In Co. Jail

Robert White, 24, of Charlottetown drew a three month sentence in Queen's County Jail when he appeared before Judge C. St. Clair Trainor in Queen's County Court Tuesday morning. White pleaded guilty to a charge of unlawfully entering the dwelling house of Lloyd Weeks, Water Street, Dec. 17 1958 "with intent". Defence Counsel J.O.C. Campbell, Q.C. pointed out to the court that during previous hearings the accused had refrained from offering and perjured testimony. In handling down sentence Judge Trainor noting White's previous record said that the accused's difficulties seemed to result mainly from his fondness for liquor. John P. Nicholson was crown prosecutor.
