PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND HOSPITAL

The Trustees again point out that the Hospital is operated on a non-profit basis. That there is no annual campaign for maintenance. The salaries of those who serve you and the money for the necessary supplies needed for your care must come from your payments.

With the increasing cost of maintaining standard hospital services the trustees find it necessary to enforce the collection of all outstanding accounts. Individual notices have gone out and all persons affected are asked to arrange settlement to avoid the embarrassment of legal proceedings.

DEPOSITS
To avoid further accumulation of unpaid accounts the trustees find it necessary to insist on a satisfactory deposit as well as arrangements for any balance before hospitalization. This system is in effect in practically all hospitals of a size comparable to the P. E. I. Hospital.

VISITING
Visiting Hours are as follows:
Private and Semi-Private Rooms—Afternoon 2 to 4 o'clock; Evenings 7 to 9 o'clock; Wards—2 to 3 o'clock; 7 to 8 o'clock.

Maternity Floor
Private and Semi-Private Rooms—Afternoon 2:30 to 4 o'clock; Evenings 7 to 9 o'clock; Wards—2:30 to 3:30 o'clock; 7 to 8 o'clock.

The above visiting hours have been found to interfere to the least possible extent with the patients professional care and rest. For this reason visiting WILL NOT be permitted during other hours. NOT MORE than two visitors at any one time.

Also because of the danger of cross infection children are not allowed to visit in the hospital.

The above rules will be strictly enforced therefore PLEASE do not embarrass the admitting officer by asking special privileges.
