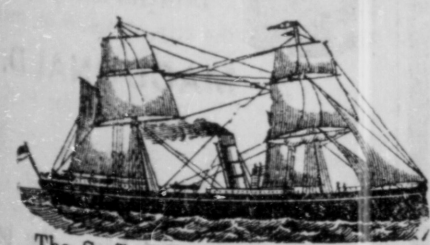

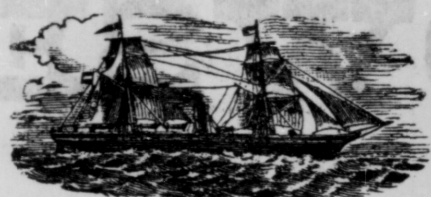

## BOER CAPITAL MOVED AGAIN

### Botha's Camp and Stores Destroyed.

#### BOERS NOW OCCUPY WATERVAL ONDER.

#### Barberton Now Proclaimed the New Seat of Government.

LONDON, Aug. 14.—The Boers have left Macbadorp, according to a Lourenzo Marques correspondent of the Daily Mail and occupied Waterval-onder in force.

A considerable portion of Commandant General Louis Botha's camp and stores, at Dalmanthua was destroyed by fire on Sunday.

According to another special despatch, Barberton has been proclaimed the new seat of the Transvaal Government.

#### SPORT IN SCOTLAND.

#### Ups and Downs of a Race.

GLASGOW, Aug. 14.—Maxey Long won the 220 yards handicap in the Celtic Club sports. Tewkesbury broke down in the hundred yards dash.

#### Troops For China.

COPENHAGEN, Aug. 13.—Russia has contracted with the Danish East Asian Company for transportation of 10,500 troops to China.

LONDON, Aug. 13.—A despatch from Shanghai quotes M. Bazaure, the French Consul, as stating that 2,000 Annamite troops will arrive there next week to protect the French settlement.

BERLIN, August 13.—The Admiralty is negotiating with the North German Lloyds and the Hamburg American Steamship Company for eight more transports.

LONDON, August 13.—A despatch to the Daily Graphic from Moscow describes the growth of the war fever against China among all classes, the feeling not being alone connected with the Pekin situation. Russia, it is said, is concentrating 400,000 men in the far east for the purpose of inflicting a series of staggering blows on the Chinese. She will not commence the real offensive until success is certain.

#### Kruger Will Hang On

LONDON, August 13.—According to the Lorenzo Marques correspondent of the Daily Express, President Kruger, in the course of an interview last Wednesday, said that the report that he intended to surrender was without foundation. He declared that the war would last a long time yet.

—In a letter written at Springs, South Africa, on June 30th, Corp. Lorue Stewart says that the Islanders there on garrison duty were in the best of health. He mentions that a number of convalescents had rejoined the regiment, among whom were W Harris, Reg Cox and Roi Harris, —all three very well and fat. E and F Companies were detailed as guard for the armored train that was to leave on the following day to patrol the line between Kroonstadt and Pretoria.

#### THE RECORD TRIP.

#### Wilhelm der Grosse Beats Record.

BREMEN, Aug. 14.—The North German Lloyds steamer Kaiser Wilhelm der Grosse, which sailed from New York on August 7th for Bremen has made the record passage of any steamer sailing from Sandy Hook to Cherbourg, covering 3,184 knots in five days, 19 hours and 44 minutes.

The average speed was 22 7-9 knots per hour.

#### SUCCESSFUL STUDENT.

#### Raymond C. Archibald Made a Doctor by German College.

The Sackville Post says: Word has just been received that the degree of doctor of philosophy has just been conferred on Raymond C. Archibald at the University of Strasburg, Germany. Mr. Archibald has the honor of being the first English speaking person to receive the degree in mathematics at this university. Among the requirements for receiving this honor were a thesis, which means original work and research on mathematical lines, or, briefly speaking, a contribution to the literature of higher mathematics, and a lecture in German before the seminary of the university, besides several written and oral examinations. Mr. Archibald was a most successful student at Mt. Allison, where at eighteen years of age he took the B. A. degree with honors, and at the same time a diploma for violin. He then spent three years at Harvard University, where he took successively the degree of B. A. and M. A. and the post graduate course, winning at the same time several scholarships, among them the Thayer scholarship of \$300. Two years ago Mr. Archibald went to Germany, where he entered the Berlin university for twelve months, continuing his mathematical studies, and then proceeded to Strasburg University, where the opportunities of studying in higher mathematics are exceptionally good. On the staff of this university are the names of Reye, Becher and Weber, who have a world-wide reputation. During these five years Dr. Archibald has pursued his violin course with relentless energy and marked success. At only twenty-three years of age Dr. Archibald has won an enviable distinction, of which not only his immediate friends, his alma mater but even his countrymen will be proud. On the 6th of September Dr. Archibald assumes head of the violin department at Mount Allison Ladies' College, which may well be congratulated on securing the services of a professor so eminently qualified to fill the responsible position.

## LATEST NEWS FROM CHINA

### Good Progress Of Relief Column.

#### ALLIES MAY NOW BE AT PEKIN.

#### Opinion In Japan Concerning Russia's Action.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 14.—The receipt of a message from General Chaffee, stating that the allies reached Hosenwu, 31 miles from Pekin, on Thursday, caused agreeable surprise.

If the same rate of progress was continued since that date, the guns of the relief column may be thundering for admission at the gates of Pekin even before this despatch reaches the eyes of the reading world.

#### JAPANESE OPINION.

TOKIO, Aug. 14.—The opinion is expressed in Japanese official circles that Russia's occupation of New Chwang justifies the despatch of British troops to Shanghai. It is believed that the other powers will be driven to take similar measures in other parts of China.
