## TIMELY NOTES ON TOPICS CONNECTED WITH Silver Fox and Mink Farming

Encouraging to fox farmers is the fact that at last week's Hudson's Bay Company's auction in London, England, white fox was 100 per cent sold with much of the goods destined for the United States. The Hudson's Bay Company officially reported that the white fox prices were easier but the sales room opinion was that quality for quality prices approximated recent Montreal and New York levels. Cross fox was unchanged and red fox mostly withdrawn. In the prices reported we note where cross fox reached a top of \$7.50. No price was mentioned for red fox. At the same sale Scandinavian blue fox dark and medium colors, sold up to \$22, and Canadian darks sold up to \$18, with pale bringing \$18.

The Dominion Fur Auction Sales Co. Ltd., held their spring sale last week. Muskrat was 100 per cent sold with prices up to \$3.00. Ranch mink was very strong and fully reflected the recent advances on other markets. Fair lots of males brought \$19.25 to \$21.50 and more ordinary goods around \$13. Females brought \$2 to \$13.50. A small collection of Silverblus sold very strongly.

Women's Wear Daily issue of May 2nd has two full pages of ads made up of seventeen different mink ranchers who are extolling the quality of their consignments to Lamson, Fraser and Huth's New York sale which took place last Thursday. Dr. Seth Osborne, well known to local ranchers, advertises 5,000 top quality Blue Diamond mink. The others all draw attention to the superior quality of their offerings. The total consignment consists of 4,500 Stewart Starlights and 48,000 other ranch mink. On Wednesday, May 10th, over 30,000 mutation mink were offered by Lamson, Fraser and Huth, all of them dressed, and the previous day almost 30,000 mutation mink were offered in the raw state. The total offering of ranch mink for the three days would be around 110,000 and in addition on Monday, May 8, 18,000 wild mink were offered. There certainly seems to be no let up of the quantity of mink available at the various auctions.

Germany, prior to World War 2, was a very important centre for fur auctions and the Leipzig sales were noted all over the world. Business is starting to perk up a bit in the western part of Germany, which is under allied rule, and we note that at a recent west German Auction 1,200 red fox pelts were sold, also a quantity of dressed and raw silver fox, dressed mink and raw mink as well as other furs. During the past year the west German fur

trade imported over \$6 million worth of fur goods.

From what we read in the press, and which we know must be correct, it is very difficult to pierce the iron curtain, yet the 21st International Lenti-gra fur auction to be held in that city July 24th, with goods on show July 14th, has a large ad in the Women's Wear Daily and it currently invites every furrier to attend this auction. They are warned to make certain they purchase inter-tourist hotel and food accommodations before leaving from World Tourists, Inc., 845 Broadway, New York City. The furs are being sold in three sections and the quantities are very large, particularly of Persian Lamb, the total of this type being in the vicinity of 300,000 peltries. There are also 5,000 raw sable, 5,000 raw mink, 10,000 Kamchatka red fox and dozens of other furs.

Albert Armand, one of the best known retail furriers in New York City, states that mink continues to be the best selling fur at his establishment. His attractive and spacious shop is in the heart of a thickly populated commercial and residential centre of New York. He says competition is keen in his area and customers are aware of all the fluctuations of price and fashion. Only better furs are desired and oddly enough he states, when prices sound too reasonable they are not interested. Our customers desire top quality furs and realize they must pay accordingly. The cape stole priced to retail at \$1,000, has been very popular and that is featured particularly.

The American National Fur Breeders Association who handle the furs of many of the best ranchers in the United States and is a co-operative organization similar to the Canadian National, held a sale of silver fox last Tuesday with an offering of 9,000 silvers and other color phases. We hope to have news of this sale next week, and look forward to it as an indication of the trend in the U. S. A.

We notice where our good friend Arthur H. Roper is offering for sale his property on the Mount Edward Road, which consists of dwelling, small farm and fox ranch. This property was originally owned by J. B. Rombough, who in the period from 1914 to the late 1920's was a prominent figure in fur farming here. He was the first man to build a cleaning plant and was an artist in that line. A fox pelted by Mr. Rombough and the pelt cleaned, was really perfection. When he sold out he left to establish a ranch in the United States, which became a well known producer of a fine strain of foxes.

Mr. Roper conducted quite a large ranch for the past fifteen years and bred many of the best foxes produced in this locality. Regrettably, like many others, he has decided to discontinue fur farming and devote all his activities to his service station, which certainly demands a lot of attention. It is a
