

# B. C. Town Chilly When Gas Fails In Cold Wave

PORT ST. JOHN, B. C. (CP)—The heat is on again in this tiny Alaska highway settlement 500 miles northwest of Edmonton. About three-quarters of the 400 houses and business establishments in Port St. John were without heat when the natural gas supply was cut off in 30-below zero temperatures about midnight last Wednesday. Gas service was resumed late Thursday.

Before the last flame sputtered out Wednesday night volunteer crews fanned out into a bitterly cold night to check safety regulators. Another group of volunteers began improvising heating to save merchandise stocks, restaurant supplies and other perishable items.
