IN MEMORIAM

JOHN ALFRED MCEACHERN
The death occurred at Lakeville on October 1, 1958, of John Alfred McEachern in his 93rd year. He had been under doctors care for some time, but was able to be up and about. McDonald, who also attended him during his illness and was at his bedside in his dying moments. Pallbearers were Charles MacDonald, Charles Campbell, Hugh B. McEachern, Livingstone Rose, Lurgus McInnis and Lloyd Rose.
