Stilbestrol
Said Used
In Abortion

OTTAWA (CP)—Stilbestrol, a drug used by farmers to increase the weight of beef cattle, is being used by humans to cause abortions, the Commons agricultural committee was told Thursday.

Percy Noble (PC, Gray North), who made the charge, said the drug also is capable of sterilizing humans if they consume beef that contains a build-up of the feed additive, in complaining about the drug's dangers. Mr. Noble did not elaborate on his statement that the drug is used to bring about abortions in humans.

Immediately, the committee set up a sub-committee to investigate the possibility of a health hazard to humans. It is expected to report to the Commons committee next Tuesday.

H. W. Danforth (PC, Kent) said the drug is now readily available to any farmer in any quantity.

He said the Food and Drug Act specifies meat containing drugs cannot be sold.

"But as it stands now, I wouldn't even be investigated and prosecuted until a dozen people died and another dozen became sterile," Mr. Danforth said.

Mr. Noble, a mink rancher, said he lost 200 mink this year before discovering stilbestrol was being used in the mink feed. Scores of others became sterile, he said.

Mr. Noble said stilbestrol is sometimes used to abort cattle if a farmer decides to sell beef when the prices are good instead of waiting for the calf to be born.

The drug normally is mixed into cattle feed at a feed mill, but farmers are permitted to buy it in capsule form at drug stores without prescription.

Caribou Said
Threatened
By New Dams

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP) The core of the Newfoundland caribou population is seriously threatened by part of a proposed hydro-electric development in the province, says a man credited with saving the herd once before.

Tom Bergerud, quitting as chief wildlife biologist after 10 years, expressed bitterness in an interview over what he feels is short-sighted development of vast wilderness areas planned with too little attention to wildlife.

A planned road from the Green River to the White Bear River dam, part of the Baie d'Espoir hydro-electric project, in what had been set aside as a wilderness area, would allow public access to many caribou.

"That road presents a serious threat to one-quarter of our caribou herd," he said. "We're not sure what the effect would be on what damage would be caused but it could be enough to wipe it out altogether."

The caribou migration route might be forcefully changed, poachers would be able to run wild and forest fires likely would be come a menace. He suggested an alternative route.

THREATENED APPEAL
Mr. Bergerud, said much of the natural appeal of the south-west coast and central Newfoundland area was threatened by the power development which would flood a vast area.

Bergerud, from Minneapolis, Minn., plans to work on a thesis toward a doctorate in wildlife biology at the University of British Columbia.

His work in finding lynx attacks on caribou calves was the cause of a severe decline of the herd and a resulting war on the lynx, has been credited with rebuilding the herd to its present population of about 5,000.

He said Newfoundland's wildlife service is to be merged with the forestry service and he indicated this was what prompted his decision to leave. It would mean wildlife projects will play second-fiddle to forestry development schemes.

SUGAR CROP HIT
HAVANA (AP) — Final official figure for Cuban sugar production in 1966 was 4,455,255 metric tons, the ministry of sugar industry has announced. The production reflected a sharp drop from last year's figure of 6,050,532 tons and was nearly 2,000,000 tons shy of Premier Castro's 6,500,000-ton goal for the year. Castro, who has set a production goal of 7,500,000 tons for 1967, blamed this year's reverse on extreme drought.
