## TRIBUTE TO REV. MR. WITHYCOMBE.

Address and Purse Presented by the Boys of Summerside.

An interesting meeting took place on Friday evening at the Western school when the Rev. J. M. Withycombe was presented with an address and purse by the Boys' Brigades of Summerside and St. Eleanor's.

A number of prominent citizens were present on the invitation of Captain Campbell of the brigade. The Captain presided and on behalf of the boys delivered an eloquent and impressive oral address, reviewing the history of the brigades here and in other parts of the province and attributing the inception and success of the movement to Mr. Withycombe. At the conclusion of the address he called upon Lieutenant Williams to present the purse, who immediately stepped to the front, saluted, presented the purse, saluted again, and returned to the ranks.

Mr. Withycombe made a feeling reply, said good-bye to the boys in a feeling address pregnant with good thoughts and practical Christian advice. Speeches were made by the Rev. Neil McLaughlin, pastor of the Methodist Church, the Rev. W. H. Smith, of the Presbyterian Church, Messrs. J. H. Bell, William Stuart of Sinclair & Stuart, Neil McLeod and Richard Hunt. All spoke in the highest terms of Mr. Withycombe's high character as a Christian and as a public spirited citizen and of his associations with all classes of the people as being that of an ideal Christian gentleman and of course deeply regretted his intended removal from them. Mr. Withycombe again spoke thanking all for their kind words and good wishes for himself and Mrs. Withycombe. God Save the Queen and three rousing cheers for the commander-in-chief of the Boys' Brigade brought the proceedings to a close.

## WINTER NAVIGATION.

Commercial Traveler's Opinion of the Stanley.

Speaking to a reporter Saturday with regard to the new ice breaking scheme, a commercial traveler gave his opinion that some of our public men and merchants suggest to the Government that they have the Stanley, which formerly did good service between Pictou and Georgetown, P. E. Island, and which there proved a success, and is laid up on the Island during the winter months, as the Government have obtained a larger steamer for the route. Any commercial traveler, he says, can inform the public that the Stanley could keep our port clear if the Government would only give it a trial, instead of having the steamer doing nothing and being a source of expense to the country simply in order to satisfy a few politicians on the Island who want the earth and all that is on it. "If you get the Stanley in Quebec once," he says, "it will never leave the route."—Quebec Chronicle.

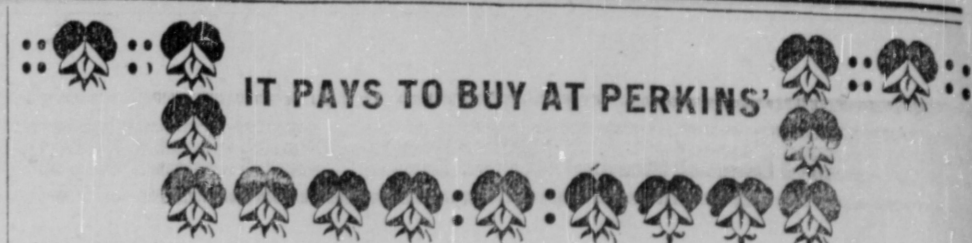
