Khrushchev To Visit China

MOSCOW (AP) — Premier Khrushchev disclosed Friday he is going to Peking Sept. 23, the day after he returns from his visit to the United States. His aim clearly is to keep Red China fully informed of his talks with President Eisenhower. Khrushchev told of his plans for the trip, without discussing the purpose, in a chat with Poland's Premier Jozef Cyrankiewicz and other officials at a reception opening the Polish industrial exhibition in Moscow. This will be his second visit to Peking in little more than a year.

Labor Rights Are Seen Under Levere Attack

OTTAWA (CP)—Organized labor in Canada is under attack as never before, president Claude Jodoin of the Canadian Labor Congress said Friday. In a Labor Day statement, he said that those who stand to gain from a weakened labor movement would impose restrictions which would seriously interfere with the rights of workers to make a free choice of their organizations and to bargain collectively. Organized labor had always been in the forefront of the struggle for shorter hours and better wages. 'Recently we have been hit by a four-day conference with Mao Tse-tung there last summer was followed by a switch in Soviet tactics toward a summit conference. In Washington, U.S. officials regarded it as understandable that Khrushchev planned to visit the Communist allies. The Peking regime is holding its 10th anniversary celebration in October and it is customary for top Communists from other lands to attend.
