

# King George V Criticized Anti-Semitism To Envoy

LONDON (Reuters) — King George V criticized Nazi anti-Semitism to a Hitler envoy shortly after the German dictator came to power, according to a volume of captured German documents released today.

This latest volume of captured documents on Hitler's foreign policy was edited jointly by British, American and French officials. It covers the period from Oct. 15, 1933, to June 13, 1934—within the first 18 months of Nazi rule.

The document on the late king is a report from Leopold von Hoesch, then German ambassador here, to the Nazi foreign ministry on a talk he had with George V on April 24, 1934.

The envoy quoted the king as saying Nazi Germany's anti-semitic policy was the main reason for the termination of British sympathy with Germany which followed the First World War.

The volume also records exchanges between Nazi envoys and the late Pope Pius XII — then Eugenio Cardinal Pacelli, papal secretary of state—in which the Vatican attempted to protest the situation of German Roman Catholics.

**TRY TO AVOID CENSURE**  
The documents disclose attempts by Nazi officials to ward off open censure by the Vatican. A 1934 note from Cardinal Pacelli was said to contain "harsh allegations".

The Nazi envoy at the Holy See told Berlin: "It will be difficult, however, to keep putting the Vatican off constantly with tactical manoeuvres."

"A clash seems inevitable unless we decide to settle the various pending questions and actually discharge the obligations we have assumed."

In 1933, von Hoesch told Berlin that Ramsay MacDonald, then Britain's Labor prime minister, privately brought up the possibility of Hitler visiting London.

The German ambassador said MacDonald told him the British cabinet did not know about this "purely personal idea" of the prime minister's. Von Hoesch said MacDonald "was sure that the Reich chancellor would receive a most friendly reception in England from the people and the government."
