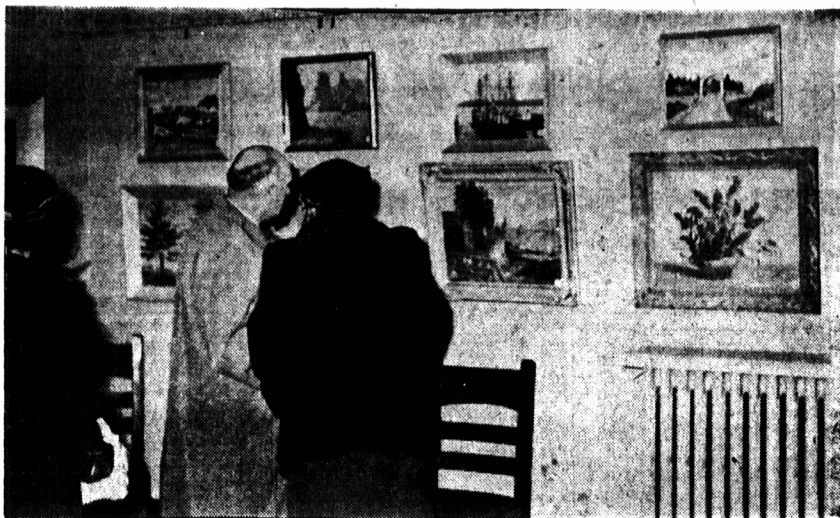

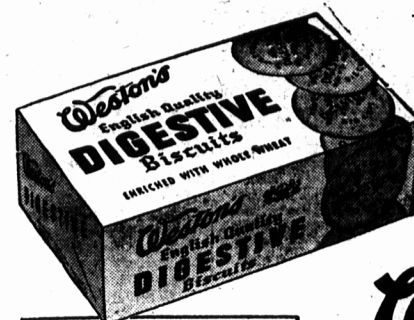

Impressive Ceremony At Georgetown War Memorial

Remembrance Day was fittingly observed at Georgetown as citizens of the town joined with veterans of two world wars in memorial services at the new monument and in the Town Hall. The parade, under the direction of Marshal Lawrence Batchelder, formed up at the Town Hall, and moved to the monument in the following order: Parade Marshal, Lawrence Batchelder; Pipers Donald MacLeod and Alan Cameron; color party; standard bearer, Michael Burke, Jr.; Veterans of World Wars 1 and 2; Ladies Auxiliary; Boy Scouts and Cubs, led by Scoutmaster D. A. MacCormack; Provincial Government representative, Mr. George E. Saville; Mayor of Georgetown, Andrew MacNeill; Town Council; clergy; school children; citizens.

On arrival at the monument, the unveiling ceremony of the new granite monument, the erection and description of which appeared in yesterday's Guardian, was a main event of the ceremonies. The program included: "O Canada", by school children; unveiling of new monument by Comrade Earl Cannon, provincial president; Canadian Legion; prayer of dedication by Comrade W. A. Paterson, "They Shall Grow Not Old." Reading of the names on the monument of departed veterans.

of both wars by Comrade Walter Walker; lament by Pipers Donald MacLeod and Alan Cameron, "Flowers Of The Forest"; Last Post; Two minutes silence; Reveille; Pibroch by Pipers; laying of wreaths. Wreaths were placed in the following order: Provincial Government by Mr. George E. Saville; Town of Georgetown, by Mayor Andrew MacNeill; Provincial Command Canadian Legion by president Earl Cannon; Georgetown Branch Canadian Legion by President Marcellus Gottle; Ladies Auxiliary Canadian Legion by William Brothers; next-of-kin of departed veterans; representatives of the following organizations also laid wreaths, Boy Scouts, Georgetown Film Council, Women's Association of United Church, Holy Name Society, Community Welfare League, Home and School Association. Wreaths were then laid by the general public.

It was also moved and unanimously carried that a vote of thanks be extended to the ladies for planting flowers and shrubs in the community cemetery. Mr. Richard MacLean reported for the rink committee stating that the north side and west end of the skating rink had been resingled and also that new roofing entirely covered the dressing room area. Mr. Charles MacLure, reporting for the building committee, stated that the rink had been tendered to the Montague Legion for \$360.00 last year. Appointments to the executive included the re-appointing of Mr. A. D. MacLure for a period of three years to complete the term of Mr. George Nicholson, who has since left the Province, and Mr. Charles MacLure, also for a period of three years.

Several other speakers all briefly addressed the gathering in humorous vein and drew round after round of applause for the many clever witticisms. Among them were Rev. Fr. Enright, Rev. J. R. McMahon, Garrison Chaplain, Police Chief MacArthur and Capt. P. A. Soucy, of the I. and A. Cadre. During the banquet dinner music was supplied by Al Blanchard and his orchestra who also played for the dance which followed.

Two Boys Scouts stood with bowed heads at each side of the monument during the entire ceremony. The parade returned to the Town Hall where under the chairmanship of Legion president, Marcellus Gottle, the following program was carried out: Hymn, "O God Our Help In Ages Past", Comrade Earl Cannon, Summer-side, Provincial President, was the guest speaker for the day. He commended the Legion branch at Georgetown for their initiative in the erection of their lovely new monument, and commended all citizens and all organizations for their very active support in assisting the Legion in this most worthy endeavor. It was indeed a tribute to their fallen comrades, and would retain forever the memory of their noble sacrifice on the field of battle in defence of their cherished freedoms.
