CHRIST'S RESURRECTION CORNERSTONE OF FAITH
Just as certainly the cornerstone of Christian belief today as they were in the days of the Apostles. Our Faith is not just a matter of holding certain truths, of cherishing certain ideals: it is a radical dependence on Christ Our Saviour, who died for us and rose again from the dead. "If Christ has not risen," says St. Paul, "vain then is our preaching, vain too is your faith." (1 Cor. 15:14).
Let us, therefore, look at the events of Good Friday and of Easter Sunday with the eyes of the Apostles, our first teachers of the following of Christ. Let us try to see with greater depth and devotion what they saw in Our Saviour's voluntary acceptance of suffering and death, and after that in His glorious Resurrection.

WERE WITNESSES
During the years to come, the first duty of the Apostles was simply to bear witness to these facts. This is St. Peter's constant theme in the Acts of the Apostles: "but the Author of Life you killed, Whom God has raised up from the dead; whereof we are witnesses" (Acts 3:15).
This is reaffirmed in many places. The Apostles were not persuading their hearers to believe anything, they simply bore witness to events that they knew had happened: the death of their Master, and the fact that he rose from the dead.
This led of course to many consequences. Since it showed that Our Lord was divine, it sent the Apostles back to all that He had ever said to them. It was the unquestionable guarantee of all His teaching, and also of the extension of His mission on earth to them. Bear witness to these events, the proceeded to teach all nations, as He commanded, spreading His Church throughout the world.

Now these events—the death and Resurrection of our Lord—are

Those eligible to attend are:
INFANTS from 6 months of age and **PRE-SCHOOL CHILDREN**
TEEN-AGERS — not attending school who have not reached their 19th birthday by December 31, 1957.
PREGNANT WOMEN — who must present a doctor's certificate of pregnancy.
The 1st and 2nd inoculations are given 4 weeks apart.
The 3rd inoculation is given 7 MONTHS or more after the 2nd.
Young children who had 2 inoculations last Spring should have the 3rd one at either the above clinics or at clinics to be held on May 21 and 22.
Young children and Teen-Agers commencing inoculations must have a parent's signed Request for Inoculations.
