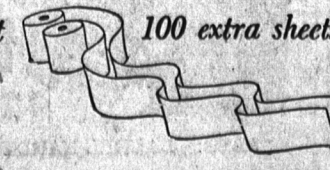

Britain Bets Millions On Aluminum In Canada

OTTAWA, Nov. 26 — (CP) — Britain, though short of dollars, is betting \$120,000,000 on Canada's aluminum future.

It was learned Tuesday that Britain has put that much money into loans to help the Aluminum Company of Canada expand production at Arvida, Que., and to build the Kitimat project in British Columbia's hinterland.

For many months the details of Britain's investment in the Canadian aluminum industry have been kept secret. There was only an announcement that Britain was earmarking \$40,000,000 for Canadian development. The full amount is three times higher.

May Develop Gold Coast
Canada is Britain's biggest aluminum supplier and likely will remain so for some years even though Britain is showing interest in an African Gold Coast development.

For 40 years Britain had plans to make the Gold Coast one of the world's great aluminum producers. A London dispatch said today that she may put the plan into effect next year.

Ultimately, the Gold Coast project would produce 210,000 tons a year, but Canada's Arvida plant already produces 450,000 tons annually.

Next summer Kitimat will start production at the rate of 83,000 tons. Eventually Kitimat will increase production to about 500,000 tons a year.

That output, together with Arvida production, would make Canada one of the world's greatest producers behind the United States with about 1,000,000 tons a year.

Britain entered the Canadian development when Korea brought a critical shortage to the essential metal, used in aircraft production.

Britain Has First Call
The money she has lent will be paid back in 20 years and during that time she will have first call on Canadian production. She has an option on the first 250,000 tons produced annually, either at Arvida or Kitimat. The option means she can forego purchase, but she has made a definite commitment for that amount annually for the next two years.

Britain is using part of her Canadian purchases to swing deals with the U. S. She agreed to divert some 40,000 or 50,000 tons last year as a swap for much-needed American steel.

This year she has agreed to provide another 50,000 tons to the U. S.
