Bauld Lone Nova Scotian In Singles

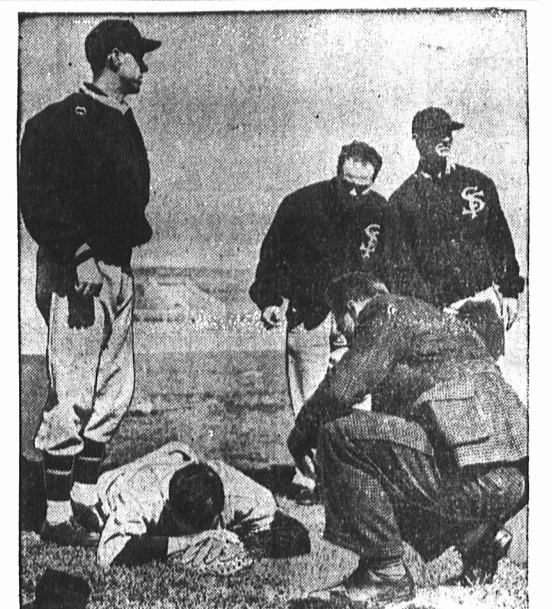
