New York Stocks

NEW YORK, (AP)—All of the stock market's strength last week was mustered in one vigorously advancing day, Monday. Thereafter the market idled along with cautious advances and retreats. The net result was a second straight weekly advance from the low of the year.

Monday's advance materialized with a rush and extended itself until it became the best of the year as measured by the Associated Press average of 60 stocks. The average was up \$1.20, biggest since mid-November of last year. Volume for the week came to 6,254,000, a daily average of 1,251,000 shares, lowest in more than six months.

RKO Theatres up 1-4 at 4-14 with 160,000 shares traded was the most active issue. Canadian issues closed the week mixed. Hiram Walker and Canadian Pacific were both up 1-8; Dome Mines and Distillers Seagram each lost 1-8. Lake Shore was off 1-8 on the American stock exchange.

Sets New World Fishing Record

SANTIAGO, Chile, (AP)—Lou Marron of California established a world fishing record last week by landing a 1.182-pound swordfish on a 39-thread line.

A 39-thread line is a line made up of 39 threads, each of which is expected to break at a three-pound pull. Thus, 39 could be expected to break from the weight of a 117-pound fish.

The old record of 1.135 pounds was set last year. Marron, who made his catch near Inhuque, battled the fish for an hour and 55 minutes.

Report New Drug For Arthritis Cases

SEIGNIORY CLUB, Que. (CP) Compound E, a drug chemically similar to cortisone, has proved useful in some cases to arthritis patients. Dr. Louis Johnson of Montreal reported last week at the annual meeting of the Quebec division of the Canadian Medical Association.

He said the compound works as well as cortisone in some cases but is not as effective when administered by mouth or when injected into muscles. Its principal value was in treatment of arthritis where one or two joints only were affected and where the disease did not respond to treatment with cortisone.

As in the case of cortisone, relief was only temporary and maintenance doses of compound E had to be given.

U. S. Steel Report

CLEVELAND, (AP)—No surplus steel will be available unless the United States has a full scale depression, Steel Magazine predicts Sunday. Producers would retire some old plants or put them on a standby basis if there was a "moderate decline in business," the metalworking journal says.

Rising prices will not ease the demand, the Magazine says, holding that "as long as steel customers continue to enjoy their present high level of business they will buy steel regardless of price."

Prices on some "extras" special items have gone up, as have a few base prices. But the magazine says that unless the CIO-Steelworkers' Union gets a pay boost, most base prices will not jump.

"Steel's" composite on scrap metal dropped last week from \$41.67 to \$39.67. U. S. mills operated at 100 per cent of their rated capacity last week, a drop of half a point.

Will Build New Cobalt Bomb Plant

OTTAWA, (CP)—A new plant for the production of the "cobalt bomb" used in cancer treatments, will be built in Ottawa by the summer of 1954, it was announced last week by Atomic Energy of Canada, Limited.

A \$660,823 contract for the plant has been awarded the George Hardy Construction Company of Toronto. The building will be erected at Tunney's Pasture, in Ottawa's west end, near the new Bureau of Statistics Building.

The bombs, in world demand for cancer therapy and made only in Canada from radioactive material produced at the atomic energy plant at Chalk River, Ont., were previously made in suburban Eastview. Space restrictions hampered expansion of the plant there, forcing the move.

Employment Outlook For Graduates Good

OTTAWA, (CP)—The employment outlook for the 11,000 graduates leaving universities this year is excellent, Labor Minister Gregg said last week. The minister said in a statement a survey has shown 18,500 jobs open for graduates and undergraduates, with more turning up each week.

As usual, there were more requests for engineering and commerce graduates than there were candidates. But it was expected also that all graduates in pharmacy, nursing, home economics, pure science, architecture, forestry and journalism would be placed.

There was at present a small surplus of graduates in agriculture, but it was expected jobs would be found for them before too long.
