**Islanders Assisted To Move**  
**OTTAWA**—A total of 13 workers have been assisted under the federal government manpower mobility program to move from Prince Edward Island to other places in Canada for employment.  
 This information was provided Wednesday in response to a question placed on the order paper by David Macdonald MP for Prince.  
 Seven workers have received loans and six others have been given grants to move from PEI and of these, all but two were from Prince County.  
 From December 28 the effective date of the program until May 31 this year, the amount paid to move workers from PEI to other places was \$48,000. Those receiving loans and \$1,210 for those getting grants, Mr. Macdonald was informed.
